Given that 32 of my 38 years as a Lutheran Minister have been in health care, I have officiated at far fewer baptisms, confirmations, and weddings than most parish pastors. The opposite is true for funerals. I have officiated at significantly more funerals than most pastors serving congregations. In some years, I would officiate at fifty funerals (almost one a week).

My most unique confirmation experience was while I was at Lutheran Hillside Village (LHV) in Peoria. With the blessing of the parish pastor, I worked one on one with a young woman who was a special needs child. We met weekly at LHV, and on Pentecost Sunday, 2014 she was confirmed at the Chapel at LHV. It was a holy day not just for her, but for the residents as well.

Like at Our Lord's, I had her select a Confirmation Verse. The verse she selected is the text for this article. In addition to selecting a verse, I asked her to write a short reflection on why she chose it. Her reflection is on the next page..

I chose this verse from Matthew, because it shows me, and all of us, how to live our lives as we believe in Jesus, and that he died for our sins.

I see Jesus whenever I am at Lutheran Hillside Village, because everyone there shares their love with me, and helps my spiritual life to grow. I want to listen to people, and help others, because God helps me, and listens to my prayers.

Quite profound for a special needs young woman just finishing eighth grade. The residents at LHV helped her grow in her spiritual life, and now she wants to go forth and help (serve) others as she has been helped (served).

The calling of this young woman is our call as well. As we participate in the worship and educational life of Our Lord's, we are then sent forth to serve.

As we celebrate the glorious fifty days of Easter, we not only are personally blessed, but called to be a blessing to those around us. Along with the special needs young woman, may we also give thanks for all of those who have helped (served) us along the way. Then go forth to help (serve) those around us.

The Sheep Hear the Voice of Jesus



The bell choir will lead the services on the second Sunday of each month at both the 8 am, and 10:45 am services.


We will continue to practice on Thursday evenings at 6:30 pm and on an occasional Sunday morning before service.

Each evening will include food and lessons to go along with the VBS theme. The last day, Saturday, will include a BBQ and Inflatable Water Slide.






MORNING GLORIES BIBLE STUDY

Collinsville *Faith in Action* is launching a Capital Campaign to support the purchase, remodeling, and maintenance of our present building at 233 North Seminary in Collinsville. And you're invited to our Campaign Kickoff Event on Tuesday, June 25, from 3 p.m. to 5 p.m. at our office. Come see our building and the changes we've already made and those we hope to make in the future. We'll be offering tours of the building so you can see our vision. And we'll have treats to eat and drink.

Over the next three years, our goal is to raise \$250,000 to purchase, remodel, and maintain our building. For over 20 years now, Collinsville Faith in Action has been helping seniors and adults with disabilities in Collinsville, Caseyville, Maryville, and State Park with door-to-door, no-cost services to support their independence. Currently we offer our three programs of Volunteer Caregivers, Answers on Aging, and Elder Connection. But it's time to move forward and imagine how we want things to be in the next 20 years. We hope to explore new programs and the frequent requests to expand into neighboring communities that we have received. Paul writes in a letter to the Corinthians that our purpose is to be God's servants working together to build "God's field, God's building." HHH Summer Camp

St. John Church is hosting HHH Summer Camp for the 7th year and is looking for volunteers to help staff this outreach ministry. The program in on Monday-Thursday for 8 weeks beginning June 3 and running through July 25 from 12:00 Noon until 2 P.M. The old saying is true that it takes a village to raise a child.

Children 4 to 18 years old come to camp for a free, hot lunch and fun activities. It is geared towards children who are food insecure during the summer because they do not get a free/reduced rate breakfast and lunch at school. Last summer we averaged 76 kids a day!

It takes approximately 100 volunteers to man this operation. We work around your schedule and vacations - you tell us how often you can be with us. We need volunteers to help with everything from assisting the cook, to tutor in reading, to teaching the kids your favorite skill or hobby and everything in between. (Volunteers have stepped up to teach German, Chess, Coding and Marbles - we even had a tie tying class last summer!) Our goals are to feed the children, provide a safe, cool place to hang out for a couple of hours, help with reading retention during the summer break, and teach the kids new skills.


