Many of us have been told that Advent is a time of waiting. And there is truth to that. These weeks go so slowly for children. It seems to them that it takes forever for Christmas to arrive. But for adults, these weeks rush by like the blink of an eye. Many of us have trouble keeping up with everything that we need or hope to do before December 25. Each day is full of creative tasks as we prepare presents, baked goods, music, clothing, our homes and our church buildings for Christmas. We are engaged in a special kind of waiting not a sit still and wait but an active waiting, a waiting in which we are preparing for what is to come.

That was true for the people of ancient Israel also. They were waiting for the promised Messiah. But they didn't sit still and wait. They studied the scriptures and attempted to live according to them as they awaited the arrival of the Light of the World, the Bread of Life, Living Water.

20-20 Vision Report

VISION 20-20 QUESTIONARE RESULTS

Thank you to everyone who completed the Vision 20-20 Questionnaire on the weekend of November 2-3. Having heard various opinions in recent months as to how the church should best focus their time, attention, and finances in the upcoming year, the Church Council thought it was prudent to get a quick glimpse of how the membership felt about our various areas of ministry. This survey was simply meant to help members of the Council and the Steering Team decide what goals and projects to further investigate in the upcoming weeks. OLLC members will have other opportunities to voice their opinions, especially as they pertain to any facility upgrades. These opportunities will most likely begin as early as the Congregational Meeting on Saturday, January 25.

In the **Ministry of Finance** category, #1 priorities were given a weight of 5 points, #2 priorities were given a weight of 4 points, #3 priorities a weight of 3, #4 priorities a weight of 2, and #5 priorities a weight of 1 point. The final rankings in this category, according to their weighted scores, were:

Similar weighting schemes were applied to the remaining ministry categories. The highest weighted items under learning, caring, worship and inviting were as follows.

Ministry of Learning: Improve/enhance Sunday School and Youth classroom space.

Ministry of Caring: Increase congregational involvement with existing ministries.

Ministry of Worship: Increase individual member participation in the worship services. **Ministry of Inviting**: Increase publicity about church programs and activities AND increase

efforts to assist visitors and prospective members.

Under **Ministry of Facilities**, the final rankings according to their weighted scores, were:

As indicated in the financial stewardship letter from Pastor Darla Ann, we will continue with our VIF/BOOM campaign to pay off our mortgage in approximately four years. The Council and Steering Team members will also coordinate further research into various facility improvements. Any campaign efforts for major improvements or projects, however, will be voted on by the congregation. Once again, the earliest any vote would take place would be at the 2020 annual meeting. If finances become available for any of the smaller projects prior to the January meeting, these particular upgrades may be made.
