Moon light, Star light, Lamp light, Candlelight, Fluorescent light, Laser light, Sun light
Light creeping through closed blinds on a winter morning
Brilliant light reflected off the white snow

What kind of light have you been seeing this winter?
What kind of light are you looking forward to seeing?
And, what kind of light do you really want to shut out of your life for a few minutes or a few days?

Epiphany is all about light. The light that came into the world in Jesus Christ is revealed in many ways. The light of Christ comes to us in at least as many different forms as the physical light we see in everyday life. Most of the time we welcome both physical light and the light of Christ. Most winter mornings I look to the windows with longing for light to overtake the darkness. But, in summer, there are times when I wish the light wasn't pouring in and waking me up before the appointed time. In my spiritual life, I look to Jesus with longing for his light to make me more compassionate, patient, loving, and just. But, sometimes, when the light of Jesus reveals injustices I wasn't aware of, I'd like to pull the covers over my head and go back to bed. The courage, strength, and backbone needed for following Jesus into places of darkness in our world is more than I think I have. Yet Jesus calls me, and he calls you, to embrace his light. We are invited to see the whole picture – both the beauty and the tragedy of life. We follow him into the darkness, so that we may be his hands in the world. During the weeks of February, listen to how the teachings of Jesus provide light for our lives. Then, push back the covers, face the light, and be Christ's servant in the world. You can make a difference.

We will join congregations around the world in singing Holden Evening Prayer on **February 5th** at 6:30 pm.

This service is beloved by many members of this congregation and this will be a special evening to use it outside of the Lenten season.

ASH WEDNESDAY

We begin our Lenten journey on **February 22,** Ash Wednesday. In ancient times, ashes were used for cleansing and to enrich the soil. So, while ashes are a symbol of our mortality, they also serve as a reminder to "come clean" before God. The worship service will begin at 7:00 pm.

For those who cannot come out for the evening worship service, "Ashes-to-Go" will be offered from 7-9 am and again from 4-5 pm. When a car drives up in front of the covered entry way to the worship center, Pastor Kratzer will come to the car window. After a brief order of confession is spoken and a scripture verse read, she will impose ashes on the foreheads of those in the car. A brief prayer will conclude this Rite of Imposition of Ashes. This type of brief service has been very helpful for those who are caregivers and cannot leave their family member in the evening. It has also been appreciated by those who are working an evening shift and those who cannot drive after dark.




