CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE

Worship Center continues to be under construction during the month of April. Availability and use will be limited.

The work in the Worship Center is progressing; work may be slow at times but we are still moving forward! The Worship Center has taken on a new look and additional changes are scheduled for the near future. The work in the kitchen will begin April 12 and the vinyl flooring reinstall is scheduled to begin April 19 (the vinyl currently in place is defective).

A beautiful foundation including kitchen remodel, new flooring, and painting has been financed; purchasing updated furnishings is next on the plan. New oak furniture and soft seating for the narthex, an OLLC communication & ministry center, new furnishings for fellowship in the commons, and restroom upgrades are planned. We cannot achieve the goal and bring new life to OLLC without your financial support.



LIVING INTO A CULTURE OF MISSION & ACTION

Congregations continually navigate changing environments, expectations, and potential for ministry growth. The purpose of Living Into a Culture of Mission and Action is to guide congregations through developing a mission and vision that is current, relevant for future ministry in an evolving culture, and in partnership with God's work in the world.

Your congregational team has taken the first steps in asking for your input by developing a congregational survey. It consists of 14 questions and typically takes less than 10 minutes to complete. We ask you to take the survey so that we may hear from as many congregational participants as possible. While research now shows we can sing a closing song or hymn together before we leave the indoor worship space, for most of the service we will participate in ways other than speaking or singing. So, for our Easter Services we would love to have you ring bells (as directed) during one or more songs. Everything from tiny bells to cow bells are welcome.



HUGGING STATIONMar 27-28 & Easter Day

To the left of the main doors to the Worship Center, a hugging curtain will be set up before and after services. As you approach the station, remain masked. Pick up two plastic "sleeves" for your arms. One person goes to the grass side and the other remains on the sidewalk. Put on the "sleeves" you have picked up and then place your arms in the arm hole bags appropriate for your height. Enjoy a good hug. Then using a sanitizing wipe, wipe down the section of curtain between the arm holes including where your masked face touched the curtain. Then place the wipe and your arm "sleeves" into the wastebasket by the curtain.

- A young man requested help from Our Lord's on one of the coldest days in the year. The young man was stranded outside and needed assistance purchasing a MetroLink ticket to get to a safe place.
 Thanks to the Pickle Fund, we were able to purchase his train ticket and pay for his rideshare, which took him to safely to another family member's location.
- 2. A young woman and her two daughters sought assistance from Our Lord's very recently they were leaving an unsafe situation and needed help lodging in the Maryville area. Thanks to the Pickle Fund, we were able to help them with hotel costs and groceries.

Because of your support, Our Lord's can be there for those in need. When people in unsafe or difficult situations think of our Church first, knowing that they can reach out without fear of judgement, we know that we are living our call to help those who are alone, afraid, and oppressed.

COUNCIL BRIEFS

This segment highlights the monthly actions of OLLC Church Council

Your Church Council held its regular monthly meeting on Monday, March 15. Listed below are some of the highlights of our meeting.

- Jaime Henderson was hired as our new Nursery Attendant. Jaime takes the place of Beth Giese, who held the position since 2014. Thank you to Beth and Andrea Giese for their many years of service to Our Lord's! Thank you to to Jaime and her sidekick Charlotte, as well, for assuming these responsibilities.
- Following a discussion on designated versus budgeted monies, the following policy was confirmed. In most cases, budgeted money will be used for a particular area of ministry before designated money. The main reason for this is designated money can carry over into the next year if not used, while budgeted amounts do not transition into the upcoming year. An exception to this policy, however, will be allowed when money is designated for a very specific need within a ministry team. In this case, designated money supersedes the budget. For example, \$1000 donated to purchase outdoor speakers will be used specifically for that purpose. If, however, a \$1000 gift was earmarked for Technology, this money would be used only when our allotted budget for Technology is exhausted.
- The Council approved a \$100 contribution to the Empty Bowl Project sponsored by the Collinsville Woman's Club. This annual soup luncheon typically donates its profits to the Collinsville Food Pantry. Due to the ongoing pandemic, unfortunately, this year's community dining event has been cancelled. Regardless, the OLLC contribution will still help combat hunger in the greater Collinsville area.
