PENTECOST, CONFIRMATION, & HOLY TRINITY

The Day of Pentecost is the culmination of the Easter celebration, and along with Christmas and Easter it is one of the three major festival days of the church year. Red is the color of the day often seen in banners, paraments, vestments, and flowers. Fire and wind are the primary images for Pentecost. Throughout the scriptures, the Holy Spirit blows where it will. At Pentecost (fifty days after Easter), the Holy Spirit dances like flames of fire on the heads of the disciples. In the power of the Spirit, those first disciples shared the good news of Jesus and the church was born.

This year, we will celebrate Confirmation on Pentecost Sunday at the 10:45 am worship service. That service will be held in the Chapel in the Pines. An outdoor reception will follow the service. Three weeks before confirmation day, on Sunday, May 2, the Confirmation Students will lead the 10:45 am worship service in the Worship Center.

Trinity Sunday functions like a hinge between the two halves of the church year. Beginning with Advent, we have spent six months hearing the stories of the incarnation, life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. On June 5 and 6, we will move into the half of the year that focuses on our response of discipleship. And in between the two halves stands a Sunday that at its heart is about relationship. The heavenly Father, Jesus the Son, and the Holy Spirit share a relationship that is filled with abundant love. That love flows from them into the world. It is that love that gives us the power to be disciples even when it is hard.


Thank you for your generosity and your hard work in completing the remodeling project thus far. The mid-point in the capital campaign has been achieved. Phase 1 (paint, kitchen remodel & flooring) funds have been raised and the work is ongoing. The kitchen cabinets arrived and nearly all cabinetry has been installed. There is still trim and countertops needed but the kitchen is taking shape! The prep work for the replacement flooring began April 19 and the installers plan to begin relaying the vinyl on April 26. By the time you read the newsletter, the flooring should be going in and the kitchen should be nearly complete!

Phase 2 tasks (signage, furnishings, restroom upgrades, a/c units) are being completed as funding allows. The entry door 'Welcome' signage has been installed, the restrooms have been repainted, and a new bathroom vanity has been purchased for the women's restroom. Purchasing furnishings for the narthex and commons will take place as funds are received.





Partnerships are mutually beneficial. What is a Partner Church and how do they and Collinsville Faith in Action (CFIA) all benefit? CFIA partners with 16 different area churches of several different denominations, and while churches may have many different missions, our partner churches collaborate with us to meet the shared goal of helping people ages 60 and older and people with disabilities remain as independent as possible. Partner churches send us volunteers, and CFIA does all the administrative work to recruit, train, coordinate, and retain volunteers providing background checks at no cost to the volunteer or the church. Partner churches support us in other ways too.

Partner churches also help support our work financially. They make donations to CFIA, and often participate in our fundraising activities. Some churches take up an annual donation for CFIA while others encourage their congregants to make regularly scheduled donations on our webpage or by mail. We thank those churches who contributed to our year-end appeal, and we look forward to your pledges and donations to our Capital Campaign which is re-launching after a Covid-19 pause.

Partner churches also help us by keeping their congregants "in the loop" about our activities, events, opportunities, and services. In turn, CFIA always lists our Partner Churches in our newsletters and marketing materials. Many partner churches spotlight CFIA at least once annually to raise awareness about CFIA. Perhaps most importantly are the congregants of your churches whom we serve. Many of our clients are members of one of our partner churches and have learned of CFIA services through their church office staff, pastors, church friends, and church bulletins and newsletters.

As we head into the summer months, your church will be receiving a newly revised Memo of Understanding (MOU) and a Faith Promise document from CFIA confirming your partnership with us to strengthen the Collinsville area community. These documents spell out some of the details of how your church and CFIA can partner together to make our community a better and more compassionate place to live. Please prayerfully consider how your partnership with us can be strengthened and how your church contributes to the betterment of our community.

In the meantime, we appreciate you letting congregants know about our many services such as transportation, social activities, vehicle licensing discounts, and Medicare counseling. Please tell your congregants about the opportunities to volunteer as well as how they can financially contribute to our organization. Our continued partnership means we will still be able to provide no-cost services to some of the most vulnerable people in our community.


