On a summer day in 1967, three groups of children arrived for their first Vacation Bible School experience. I was one of those children. The new mission congregation my family was part of was holding worship and educational activities at a local elementary school in Pierre, South Dakota. In some ways, that VBS was very much like every VBS I have been a part of, first as a child, and for the past 23 years as a pastor. Bible stories, music, crafts, games, and snacks filled each day. But in other ways, it was different from any other VBS. Among the children with whom I learned and played that summer were Native Americans from a nearby reservation and Episcopalians from a nearby congregation. In 1967, bringing these three groups of children together was a groundbreaking experiment by a new congregation that had yet to break ground for a building. And so, we learned and played and worshiped between two basketball hoops in the school gymnasium. And I remember it to this day. We were safe and loved and happy learning about the God who loves us. That is what I am hoping for this month as Our Lord's holds its first post-pandemic VBS. Over the years the ways of teaching the Bible stories, Bible verses, and biblical themes have changed. Videos of skits, music, and animated characters add to the fun. Outdoor venues for stations which the children rotate through make the whole experience feel more like summer camp. But the basics remain the same. So, I invite you to pray for all the volunteers preparing for VBS here at Our Lord's. And once you've offered a prayer for them and their work, please mark your calendars to pray each Wednesday morning in July for the children, especially those experiencing VBS for

the first time. Pray that they will be safe, loved, and happy as they get

to know the God who loves them.



GIVING EMPHASIS



Lutheran Campus Ministry of Illinois (LCMI) is the Giving Emphasis for the month of July. LCMI works to support the Lutheran Campus Ministries of the C/SIS Synod (University of Illinois and Illinois State), the Northern Illinois Synod (Northern Illinois U) and the Metro Chicago Synod (Northwestern, University of Chicago, and South Loop Campus Ministry).

Campus ministries provide a place for worship and fellowship with other students, but that is not all they do. In recent years, the campus pastors of LCMI have helped students with food insecurity and providing a safe haven from the many pressures of college life.

Our congregation has two members who are active in these ministries: Garrett Short at Northwestern and Kate Henderson at U of I. Campus ministry has played an important role in my life as well. My parents met at a Lutheran Campus Ministry Event in 1949 when my Dad was an engineering student at Illinois Institute of Technology and my Mom was a nursing student at St. Luke's Hospital in Chicago. I was active in Lutheran Campus Ministry at Purdue, and in 1993, a Lutheran Campus Pastor officiated when Tim and I were married.

One final point, I participated in the "Growing Young" book group earlier this year. The book emphasizes the need to prioritize young people and to fuel a warm community. Lutheran Campus ministries do both of these things as well as what the book calls "unlocking keychain leadership". Lutheran Campus ministries encourage young people to be involved in worship and in organizing activities. Lutheran Campus ministries play an important role in keeping young people engaged in the church and in inviting new members to our fellowship.

RESTORING OUR LORD'S HOUSE

The end is in sight! The remodel is nearly complete, at least most of the mess has been finished!

The kitchen is fully functional and looks wonderful! The women's restroom has been updated with paint and new cabinetry; and the men's restroom has been painted. The nursery remodel is complete and the space is being **Funds Received** filled with toys for the little ones. The narthex and commons remodel are finished and the spaces are waiting for furnishings. Furniture for the narthex will be ordered by the end of June with a 6 month ETA. Once additional funds are received fellowship and coffee service furniture, new table tops along with new chairs will be ordered for the commons. The youth room has undergone an update during the remodel as well. Thanks to an endowment received from the Harry Thiel Estate, new furniture for the youth room was purchased. There are still a few items to be ordered for the space but the room is looking great. The latest addition to the remodel includes the purchase of two hip high chairs for the sanctuary. Designed for individuals who have trouble sitting at common chair seat angles, these chairs will reduce the angle of an individual's hips in relation to the floor and make it easier to sit and rise.

Thank you to everyone that has worked on the remodel, it has taken a great deal of time and effort on the part of many individuals. And thank you for your financial contribution to "Restore Our Lord's House." Funds collected to date exceed **\$95,000.** Although we have accomplished a great deal, there are still funds to be raised and work to be done. OUTREACH



The Fourth of July holiday is a chance to remember and appreciate the independence we enjoy in our country. We at Faith in Action are also reminded of our purpose to help people over the age of 60 and people with disabilities remain as independent as possible in their homes and in their community. How do we meet this purpose? We do it in partnership with you!

We offer three core programs to help our neighbors remain independent: Assisted Transportation, Elder Connection, and Answers on Aging services. All of these are offered at no cost to our clients. We remember that each client has different needs to maintain his or her independence. While some clients may need a ride to a doctor's appointment, others drive themselves but may need a volunteer to do minor home repair. Some clients are at risk of social isolation, so volunteers phone them each week for a friendly chat. We also have many clients requesting help from our Answers on Aging professional so that they can choose the right Medicare plan. It is your continued support and involvement working with our staff that means we can meet the varied needs of our community.

For more than 23 years, Collinsville Faith in Action has recruited, trained, and organized volunteers from area churches. We call upon you now to renew your partnership with us. We ask church leaders to help us recruit volunteers. We ask church members to put their faith into action.

Prospective volunteers may call 618-344-8080 to discuss the most suitable volunteer positions. Just as each client has unique needs, each volunteer brings unique gifts and interests. We need volunteers and board members from our Partner Churches to have the greatest impact in the community. We are also re-launching our capital campaign so that we can maintain our office building and serve others as a non-profit organization well into the future. Thank you to pastors and church leaders for helping us recruit volunteers, stay fiscally responsible, and remain a strong organization.

LIVING INTO A CULTURE OF MISSION AND ACTION REPORT

A "BIRD'S EYE" VIEW OF THE PROCESS

The Mission and Action Team was convened to prepare a plan which will chart the future direction of the congregation's ministry programs, services, operation, and funding.



The team began by attending cohort meetings on Zoom with a team of 4 consultants from GSB and people from five other congregations serving on their congregational Mission and Action Teams. We began by learning the importance of understanding our particular congregation's identity. We held internal team meetings to prepare three customizable areas of a congregational survey to be used by all the congregations. The rest of the questions in the survey were the same for all congregations in this process.

After members of Our Lord's completed the survey, our consultant met with us by Zoom to share the survey results. We have been working with those answers during the past two months as we identify the core values of this congregation.

We are also looking at what members tell us as they read the weekly Wednesday devotional and answer the three questions. Listening to God is a major part of the process. Thankfully, every member of the congregation can participate in that step.

The next step is to identify the Ministry Result Areas (which are the strategy/major initiative items in our strategic plan). Then the goals, objectives, person responsible, sub-objectives, funding needed, and funding source will be identified for each Ministry Result Area.

When completed, the resulting plan will clearly convey Vision 2025 and the steps needed to move our Lord's Lutheran toward that vision.




