As we headed north to begin our exploration of Route 66, my job was to read the brown signs. The "Mother Road" is lined with playful attractions, much history, and lots of turns and curves. The "brown signs" serve to distinguish between three different pathways the highway took between 1926 and 1985 (when it was decommissioned). I was surprised at how short the time span was for the highway between its beginning (1926) and the first rerouting (1930). The route during the first four years took travelers through the heart of each village, town, and city. As congestion in larger communities became a problem, the decision was made to reroute the highway so it would by-pass those areas. A few sharp turns were also modified. But a mere ten years later, it was time to re-route again. The 1940-1977 route allowed for expansion into a four-lane highway. Businesses in towns that had been on the route either relocated or closed as traffic ceased to come by their original location. Change was the most consistent feature of life on Route 66 from 1926 to 1940. That surprised me.

Re-routing. It's sometimes necessary far sooner than we had ever imagined. It's not just the present that changes rapidly. Change and disorientation and re-orientation have always been a part of life. We find that in the scriptures, especially in the psalms. When those writers of those early songs of the community of faith found their lives had been re-routed, they poured out their disorientation to God in song. And as they did so, they began to recognize God's presence still with them in the midst of change. So, when you find your life re-routed, you might want to write your own psalm. Sing it to God. Discover the peace that comes as you are re-oriented and then leave some "brown signs" so that others may see the changes that brought you to where you are today.



Funds collected to date exceed **\$100,000**.....thank you for your generosity!



Fall 2021: The Gift Of The Spirit

Celtic Christians likened the Holy Spirit not to a dove, but to a goose. In these three sessions of the fall Gather Bible study, the Rev. Sara Olson-Smith, associate pastor at St. Paul Lutheran Church, Davenport, Iowa, will lead us on our own divine Wild Goose chase. We'll track the Holy Spirit's actions throughout the Bible and throughout our lives. We'll explore how the Spirit moves God's people into adventures and lives we would never dare risk on our own.

Session 1: Spirit of God: Revealer and resource (September)

The Holy Spirit might be the most misunderstood or mysterious member of the Trinity, but the Spirit of scripture is not shy. Together we'll uncover the bold, truth-telling Spirit active in our lives. We hope to be meeting in person, but all but the final session of this course can be done on Zoom if participants prefer due to their own time restraints or health concerns. Adult Bible Study

Sundays at 9:15 am

This study will begin on September 12. It will address the question of "How Jesus Became God." The course will cover the transformation of Jesus from Jewish preacher to Lord God within its historical context, will look at the focal points of Jesus's ministry and whether he considered himself divine, will examine the key event that promoted the idea that Jesus was God, and will study the Christian theological persuasions of the 2nd, 3rd, and 4th centuries.

Questions Bible Study

This study will begin on September 13. It will explore the topic of "Thinking About Religion And Violence." It will explore the factors involved in the increase in religious violence, including the history of religious violence, its multiple manifestations, its scriptural justifications, and how its perpetrators perceive the world. It will look at the power of religion and violence individually and separately, will explore the most common housings for religious violence, will examine how religious violence is used to construct and police other kinds of identity, specifically race, gender, and sexuality, and will then shift to a course of case studies, including slavery and the persecutions of religious traditions like Native American religions, Catholicism, Judaism, Islam, and so-called cults, as well as violence within these traditions.

LICMA:

While the statements articulating the previously assumed congregational values are being improved through the input of our Council, Steering Team, and the consultant working with us, our OLLC Mission and Action Team is at work on the next components of developing a strategic plan. We are selecting Ministry Result Areas for 2021-2025 and listing objectives and goals under each. We are also developing a Vision Statement to help all of us have a mental picture of what we will become as a congregation as we live out our mission and values.

STEERING TEAM:

Our primary work when we met at the beginning of August was coordinating the many parts and pieces of two upcoming events: God's Work Our Hands Sunday and our OLLC booth at the Maryville Fall Festival. Both these events involve multiple ministry teams from the service, fellowship, worship, and education areas of our life together as a congregation. The meeting also included updates from each Steering Team member. Conversation during the pastor's report prompted team members to share with the pastor how meaningful the classes on spiritual gifts offered a few years ago had been for them. Pastor Kratzer will plan to offer that type of class later this fall and to incorporate more "mission minutes" by congregational members during the worship services.




