In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God swept over the face of the waters.

Genesis 1:1-3

I have been noticing the darkness as I drive home at the end of the day. It has a beauty I've never paid attention to before. If it's not too cold, I'll stand by the car for a few minutes after getting out. Peace and calm surrounds me as I stand in the darkness. It is as if I am "making friends" with something I once feared and toward which I still harbor a bit of suspicion. The interplay of light and darkness is explored in Advent. But I have always focused on the light. Yet, both darkness and light carry the mystery of God. The light God created complements the darkness rather than extinguishing it. Darkness still has a purpose in the order of creation. Darkness is necessary for life. Seeds germinate in the dark. Large bodies of water become calmer at night. And during the night, without the distractions of the day, darkness gives us space to think, to hear, and to listen.

A lot of wonderful things that happen in scripture are enveloped in darkness. Jacob lays down to sleep and a staircase between heaven and earth filled with angels (messengers) appears. Samuel lays down to sleep and God's voice comes through the darkness to call him into his role as a prophet. Those are just two Old Testament examples. And in the New Testament? Well, all the major parts of the birth story of Jesus are surrounded by darkness. Like every child, Jesus is nourished and protected in the darkness of his mother's womb. It is dark when an angel tells Joseph not to be afraid to take Mary as his wife. It is dark when the shepherds are tending their flock and the angelic choir breaks into the darkness to light up the night sky. If it were not for the darkness, the magi could not have seen and followed the bright evening star. Perhaps darkness holds more promise, more beauty, and more holiness than I realized. So my wish for you this season is that you will encounter the mystery and glory of God during these long Advent nights.

Notes On Advent & Christmas:

Advent

This season starts at the end times and moves us to the beginning of the life of lesus. It is a time of preparation and a time of waiting. Not the kind of waiting where one sits still for long periods of time. Not the kind of waiting one does in a doctor's office. No, this is a waiting that prepares us for both the celebration of Jesus' first arrival and for his arriving again. In this time of holy anticipation, we move toward lesus. We prepare our hearts, our homes, and our church. We switch the order of worship a little bit on Sundays, setting aside the Hymn of Praise and letting the Kyrie and the hymn "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" express our longing. On Saturdays, the song "Light the Candle" carries us through the Advent weekends to the moment when our hopes will be fulfilled in Jesus.

Christmas

For twelve full days we get to celebrate the Incarnation. Jesus takes on the same skin, tissues, organs, and blood that all humans share in common. He is made out of the same dust as the first earthbeing, adam. God's choice to speak to us face to face overwhelms us with joy. So, we sing. Again and again we use the words of the angels who lit up the night with their song: "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those whom he favors."

Restoring Our Lord's House

We are nearly there! Only two tasks remain on the Restore Our Lord's House project list --- new air conditioning units for the fellowship hall and sealing the sanctuary ceiling. Both jobs will be held off until sufficient funds have been raised. All other tasks identified for the remodel have been completed! We could not have done this without you.

The carpeting and painting of the fellowship hall was completed and all furniture, including the glass display cases, have been set in place. The youth room remodel is complete as well. A large bookcase for the collection of OLLC ministry items was recently received and installed in the hallway near the narthex. We anticipate delivery of upholstered seating for the narthex, oak furniture for narthex and commons, as well as new tables for the commons in early spring.



Thank you for your prayers, your financial support, your time and your patience during the remodel.

OLLC can now move toward a future with a renewed focus on community, ministry and sharing God's love.



SOS SOUP KITCHEN

The holiday season is rapidly approaching. You already see Christmas items in the stores and radio stations have begun playing Christmas carols. And after a much scaled back COVID Thanksgiving last year, many of us are looking forward to Thanksgiving and Christmas celebrations with the family this year. Reflecting on the past year and the future, I must admit I feel abundantly blessed.

At the same time, I know there are those in our community who live with food insecurity and struggle to provide basics for their family. We at Our Lord's have been able to support Collinsville's Spirt of Sharing (SOS) soup kitchen for quite some time. We were serving our Taco dinner to approximately 90+ patrons monthly pre-COVID. Over the last 18 months we've provided over 400 lunches for the SOS to share with our community. Again, the congregation has been very generous supporting the effort with monetary contributions.

SoS is now back to serving dinners and will be boxing up meals for drive through pick up. Beginning in December OLLC will resume serving dinners monthly. Our Confirmation class will be participating in preparing the dinner for the December 14th drive through. We will need adults to serve the meals at the drive through. (We prefer vaccinated members.) With the start of the new year we will serve a taco casserole, our first day of service is January 13. I will publish the following months schedule at a later time.

I will have a signup sheet in the narthex for both December and January dinners. I want to again thank everyone for their generosity in prayer, financial support, food preparation and serving the meal. Through this program we can share God's love with the community.

LICMA

For nine months, the LICMA Team has worked to discern our direction as a congregation for the next three years. We received input from the members of the congregation through the survey in the spring, through the digital bulletin board throughout the summer, and through many, many conversations.

Last month we shared with you the values we identified that are at the core of who we are as a congregation. During worship services in November, Pastor Kratzer began sharing the areas of focus for Our Lord's Lutheran during the next three years. Our Vision 2024 plan lists those as Ministry Result Areas. 
