We can add fertilizer so the soil in which we live becomes more nourishing for us. Then we will be ready to bloom where we are planted – in our homes, neighborhoods, workplaces and volunteer sites.

Earth Day is on April 22, the Friday after our big Easter weekend celebration. Caring for the earth is certainly an appropriate way to respond to the life-giving good news we receive at Easter. The apostle Paul writes, "For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the children of God... that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to decay and will obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God." (Romans 8:19 and 21) The resurrection of our Lord is good news for both people and the earth! May these final weeks of Lent bring springtime into your soul and your soul into communion with the earth.



COOLING OUR LORD'S HOUSE

Winter is over and summer is just around the corner! Now is the time to replace the HVAC system for the rear portion of the Worship Center, including the Fellowship Hall. The furnace units are 30+ years old, and the AC units are not working properly. The Church Council sought bids from three companies to replace both the cooling units and the heating system. A bid from Polar Aire Heating & Air, Maryville, was accepted. The bid of \$33,741.09 includes installation of four 96% 2 stage high efficiency gas furnaces and four 16 seer high efficiency air conditioners. Work is scheduled to begin in May; by summer we will have a high efficiency system in place!

April will kick off a 3-month endeavor to increase giving over and above our regular giving to support Cooling Our Lord's House. The nearly \$34,000 needed may seem a large amount of money to collect in a relatively brief amount of time, but it is possible with your financial support. The balance from Restoring Our Lord's House, \$4540, will be applied to the Cooling campaign. We are asking that everyone prayerfully consider making a sacrificial gift to Cooling Our Lord's House. Each family's/individual's financial needs and responsibilities vary; therefore, one-time contributions or 3 monthly installments are options. The campaign goal can be reached if everyone contributes.

For example, if

- 2 families/individuals contribute \$1500 per month,
- 3 families/individuals contribute \$1000 per month,
- 4 families/individuals contribute \$500 per month,
- 5 families/individuals contribute \$200 per month,
- 6 families/individuals contribute \$100 per month, and
- 7 families/individuals contribute \$50 per month

we will achieve the goal of Cooling Our Lord's House! Funds received beyond the HVAC system installation cost will be used to install LED lighting in the sanctuary. We can reach the campaign goal if we work together.

Please prayerfully consider making a contribution above and beyond your regular giving. Contributions to Cooling Our Lord's House can be made by writing a check to Our Lord's noting "Cooling Our Lord's House" in the memo line, arranging an ACH withdrawal from your bank account, or making an online contribution by going to the church website. With your financial support we can achieve the campaign goal.



The hidden surprise in these sweet rolls hints at the reason behind Easter's joy.

What you need:

- ½ cup chopped pecans
- 10 uncooked frozen rolls, thawed
- 10 large marshmallows
- ½ cup sugar
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- ½ cup melted butter
- ¼ cup brown sugar
- Adult help

What you do:

- 1. Grease a round baking dish. Sprinkle pecans on the bottom.
- 2. Flatten each roll. Place a marshmallow in the center, wrap dough around it and pinch edges together.
- 3. Combine sugar and cinnamon. Dip each roll into melted butter and coat with cinnamon-sugar. Place in pan, seam side down.
- 4. Sprinkle brown sugar and remaining butter over rolls. Cover with plastic wrap and let rise 30 minutes.
- 5. Bake at 350 degrees until golden brown, about 30 minutes. Cool in pan.
- 6. As you bite into a roll, you'll see the marshmallow has melted, leaving an empty center just like Jesus' empty tomb!


