As we move from last month's focus on Our Stewardship of Vocation to this month's emphasis on Our Stewardship of Talents, I ran across a quote from M. C. Richards that ties the two together. She writes, "An artist creates out of the materials of the moment, never again to be duplicated. This is true of the painter, the musician, the dancer, the actor, the teacher, the scientist, the businessman, the farmer – it is true of us all, whatever our work, that we are artists so long as we are alive to the concreteness of a moment and do not use it to some other purpose." We often think of the first four types of people she named as people possessing special talents. She makes it clear that teachers, scientists, entrepreneurs, and farmers also have talent. Talent that is used to observe, create, and grow things and people.

So, this month, let's expand our understanding of what talent is. God has bestowed gifts on each one of us. Those talents are sometimes very visible to others in public settings. But there are many, many talents that go unseen. They are no less valuable. Here's a quick list of talents to get you thinking about both your own talents and the talents of those around you: baking, carpentry, crafting, delegating, drama, growing plants, organizing, public speaking, quilting, sewing, writing, painting, understanding technology, listening, healing, making music, athletic ability.

You've got talent. Use it to bring joy to yourself and others. That will bring honor to the God who created you!

AUGUST GIVING EMPHASIS

As the Giving Emphasis Team considered ways for Our Lord's Lutheran members to engage in our Core Strategy to "Serve one another, our communities, the wider world, and God's creation" we identified some local organizations that we can partner with to serve people who have been displaced from their homelands. The International Institute of St Louis is one such organization. They help those who have come to this country by offering essential economic and cultural integration services. They also work to build mutually respectful relationships between foreign-born newcomers and members of the metro-StL community. Education, counseling, training, and employment are among the services being offered to arriving Afghans. They are also preparing for the possibility that as the war in Ukraine continues, it is likely there will be Ukrainians who seek to resettle in the United States.

Those from Afghanistan who are being helped by the International Institute generally fall in one of the following groups:

- Special Immigrant Visa (SIV) recipients. These visa holders worked for the U.S. government or government contractors in Afghanistan for at least a year; the visas also cover their immediate families.
- Refugees. They include those who worked for the U.S. government or government contractors for less than a year in Afghanistan, who worked for U.S.-funded programs or projects, or were employed by a U.S.-based media organization or NGO. Spouses and children also are covered.
- SQ/SI parolees. These are individuals with pending applications for SIV status.
- Humanitarian parolees. This final category is for Afghans who do not have SQ/SI status, and who will likely be seeking asylum in the United States.

The International Institute hosts an annual food and entertainment festival annually as a deliberate step to connect people throughout the metro-STL area to our immigrant neighbors. It is a chance to dine, hear music and stories, and discover the entrepreneurial spirit of immigrants throughout the metropolitan area. It will take place on August 27 & 28 in Tower Grove Park on August 27 & 28 from 10 am - 6 pm.





Since late February, Russia's war against Ukraine has dominated the headlines. Thanks to many generous donors, Lutheran Disaster Response has been responding faithfully to the resulting humanitarian and refugee crises. And in addition to Ukraine, LDR is still responding to disasters that don't get as much coverage, such as the March storm system that moved across much of the Southern United States. A tornado touched down in southern Louisiana and severely impacted Arabi, LA, and Chalmette, LA. Following the tornado, LDR supplied a grant to Gethsemane Lutheran Church in Chalmette, which became the only open food pantry in the parish due to widespread damage from the tornado. Gethsemane Lutheran is also collaborating with the Gathering, a church in Arabi. Due to damage from Hurricane Ida, the Gathering's preschool and day care programs have been

COUNCIL BRIEFS

Summer greetings from the Council,

Another summer will soon be gone, seemingly before it even got started. Vacations, camps, backyard bar-b-ques, reunions, relaxing in the sunshine; where did the time go? The same can be said for life at OLLC. New opportunities were planned while other activities were on hiatus; we experienced joys and sorrows; and completed everyday tasks as well as outstanding achievements-- the summer at OLLC has flown by!

Discussing summer activities, upcoming events and planning for a brighter, debt-free future were topics discussed during the July council meeting. The agenda included discussion of the Sunday Service Survey, Sunday School Schedule, and a mid-year financial report.

- The Sunday Service Survey results favored continuing the single service on Sunday mornings, service beginning at 9 am with education hour beginning at 10:15 (Sunday School begins September 11). The single service schedule will be re-evaluated again at the end of 2022 with consideration for changing the schedule in January.
- Sunday school will begin September 11; an exciting, fun filled day of service and special activities are being planned. More information will follow next month!
- The council received mid-year financial reports from Dave Gocken; general fund giving was up 11.8% from 2021 and VIF contributions increased 13.3% compared to same time last year. If giving continues at the same rate through end of year we will be within \$5000 of the 2022 budget. Praise God!

As we move into the second half of 2022, it is time to think about the future at OLLC. We are reminded that there is still a church mortgage but the balance gets smaller with each monthly payment. We should not lose the momentum but we need to keep in mind we WILL be debt-free and celebrating in grand fashion soon!

Summer is a great time for us to experience the joy that living in Christ brings us, allowing us to enjoy all that God provides. As we experience God's joy through the beauty of nature, the sound of children's laughter, or being together with friends and family, be sure to share it. Our joy is multiplied when we do.

MarketPlace: Handwork of India works with over 400 artisans, most of whom are women, who are organized into 13 independent cooperatives in India. Four of these cooperatives are Fabric Artisans, who dye our custom fabrics using an array of traditional techniques including hand block printing, ikat, batik and tie-dye. The other nine are the Artisan Cooperatives, where the fabric is cut, sewn and hand embroidered to complete the products.

The different cooperatives vary in size, structure, history and location. The common thread is adherence to the principle that the women are involved in decision-making at all levels of the business, and that they can plan and execute programs that enhance their lives and make a difference for their families and their communities. An artisan must meet certain criteria to qualify to join any of the cooperatives. These would include a background of economic hardship and limited access to employment opportunities in the general community. Many of these women have been deprived of educational opportunities, and some have faced hostility and discrimination due to their religion, marital status, or health.

What they all share, however, is a desire to become strong and independent. The design process brings members of the different groups together as they collaborate on the planning, production and delivery involved in each MarketPlace collection. There is a relationship of support and respect between all the cooperatives as the artisans build their own successful businesses.

COOLING OUR LORD'S

The new HVAC system has been installed and the campaign to fund Cooling Our Lord's House came to an end in June! Thanks to the generosity of the OLLC congregation more than 75% of the funds needed for the project have been received. The cost for the heating/cooling system for the Fellowship Hall and rear portion of the Worship Center was \$33,741; contributions currently total **\$25,900**. Additional contributions toward reducing/eliminating the deficit would be greatly appreciated.

Thank you to all who contributed toward Cooling Our Lord's House! With your financial support the rear portion of the Worship Center will stay cool and comfortable during the hottest days of summer and warm and cozy during the cold winter days ahead. Thank you again!


