Several years ago, Thrivent Financial started sending out t-shirts with each Action Team Grant. Everyone who participates in the project funded by the grant gets a t-shirt if they want one. The colors have changed over the years, but the words "Live Generously" along with the Thrivent logo remains a constant. Every time I pull out my shirt, or see someone in the community wearing theirs, I am reminded that living generously is part of being a disciple of Jesus.

This month, it is time to focus on our stewardship of generosity. What? Huh? Aren't good stewardship and generosity the same thing? Well, they are closely related but not identical. Stewardship is how we manage the resources God has placed in our care. Generosity is both a spirit and an action. A person with a spirit of generosity gives freely and frequently to others. Generosity is about far more than money. Yes, one area of generosity is sharing of resources, including money. But, there are other ways of being generous. One major area is generosity of time. And a third is generosity of relationships. In order to give generously in those areas, we need a couple of underlying things in our lives. Simplicity and "margin".

Practicing the spiritual disciple of simplicity and gaining some "margin" in our lives are ways we can engage in stewardship of generosity. Simplicity helps us unclutter our lives, letting go of excess. Simplicity helps us to realign our lives with God and God's will. All generosity starts with God. "Margin" makes space in our lives. Like the margins on a piece of paper, our lives need some blank spaces. When we create "margin" in our schedules, we have flexible time available for family and health, leisure and rest, community and God. Having more "margin" in our lives allows us to be generous with our time and talents. And that is good – both in the church and outside the church. So, this month, try taking a step toward simplicity or a step toward margin. See how it transforms your life. And then, thank God for the opportunity to live generously.

Seventeen years ago a group of volunteers from a variety of local churches led by Lutheran Social Services of Illinois came together at St. Clair's Catholic Church to begin planning for a Storybook Project at Southwestern Illinois Correctional Center. Marcine Lemke, Lynn Thiel, and Elaine Baden worked with about seven other volunteers to get the project going. Once a month we met with the inmates, helped them pick out a book for their child or grandchild and then facilitated the recording. The recording and book would be then mailed to the child. The men we worked with were always so thankful to have this opportunity to connect with their child. We heard many wonderful stories about how much their child loved listening to the recording and even sometimes took it to bed to listen to dad or granddad's recording. Although this ministry was begun to help the inmates, all of us that were volunteers were also blessed by the ministry.

So, it is with sadness that Our Lord's volunteers will be ending our work with the Storybook Project. During the last few years our church completely supported Storybook and we are extremely thankful to our congregation's generosity with your prayers, your book donations, your offerings and, of course, the many members who volunteered to help each month. Thanks to: Lynn Thiel, Susanne Richter, Debbie Meadows, Marcine Lemke, Deanne Holshouser, Carol Gocken, Dave Gocken, Marianne Cavanaugh, Kathie Brady, Elaine Baden, and Don Baden, and to the many other volunteers who worked along with us.

Please keep Lutheran Social Services in your prayers as they work with Southwestern Illinois Correctional Center to find another group to keep the Storybook Project going.

 of the ministries and outreach OLLC can (& will) engage in once we are debt-free! We will be a church

Aimed at church members and leaders alike, the book encourages reflection on the church's past so as to explore how Christians are called to be the church in today's world."

Fall Study: "Jesus And Nature: Teachers Of Faith"

Jesus often turned to the natural world in teaching, opening our eyes to see creation not just as something to be cared for, but as our teacher and kindred. This three-session Bible study will shift our perspectives and allow nature to be our teacher, through the words of Jesus and other parts of Scripture.

October 2022, Session 2: "Soil," will dig deeply into the parable of the soil (otherwise known as the parable of the seed, Matthew 13) and other Biblical accounts that relate to care for this part of creation, while looking at models of growth that involve wholeness and wellness.

October 20

Session 4: The Exodus and the Promised Land (16:51)—Like a beautiful tapestry, the Bible uses patterns of repeated events to signal really big moments in history. Learn more about the Hebrew people, their struggles and wanderings, and how the Lord went before them through it all.


