JANUARY SERVICES

TREASURED BY GOD: AN EPIPHANY REFLECTION

A newborn baby often elicits "oohs" and "ahs" from its admirers and yet developmentally, may be doing nothing incredibly remarkable—only able to focus on objects only about 18 inches in front of its face and prone to stare at any shiny object. Nevertheless, a newborn is a miracle to behold, filled with wonder for the world around it and desiring nothing more than to be fed, held, rocked, nurtured, and loved.

The gifts of the magi direct us away from the cute, cuddly, cooing baby Jesus by pointing us to who Jesus really has come to be. The magi offer gold, a possession of kings; frankincense, used in ritual to indicate the presence of the deity; and myrrh, an oil used at the time of death as well as for anointing priests. By their gifts, the wise men reveal the identity of this child: the king before whom nations will bow, the anointed high priest of God, and the suffering servant who will die for the ones he has come to serve.

The "oohs" and "ahs" we offer as we celebrate the Epiphany of Our Lord are not simply for a cooing and cuddly baby Jesus but for a God who chooses to reveal God's love and mercy by taking human form. On this day, we celebrate that God's mercy is wider and deeper than we imagined and includes all people and all nations.

All people—rich or poor, Gentile or Jew, straight or gay, male or female—are God's treasure, the precious ones for whom God is willing to die. What do we bring to honor our Lord before whom we bow? We bring the treasure of our lives poured out in praise of God and in service to others.



DECEMBER COUNCIL BRIEFS

As you are reading this, 2022 has come to a close and the new year has arrived. 2023 is a time for new beginnings at OLLC! What are your plans for the year? How will you grow spiritually? What role will you play in the changes in store for Our Lord's? Although we might look at the new year as an opportunity for change, it is important for us to be reminded the Lord our God does not change! He is the same yesterday, today and forever. Though sales and orders were not as prevalent as in the past, I know that with attendance still down, visitors to the Shop was down as well. I keep two sets of records for the Fair Trade sales. I do a church calendar year and a shop fiscal year. As of December 18th, the church year had a \$140 a week average and the shop fiscal year was \$142. Both of these numbers, I am proud to share with you.





With a few days left in the year, we can still finish up the year with a bigger bang. There are still many great gifts in the shop, still on the books, for upcoming occasions. Food & Beverages (i.e. Coffees, Teas, Nuts, Oils, etc.), as well as jewelry, scarves, arts & crafts. Please don't forget, Nativities are not just a Christmas decoration and Ornaments are not just for the Christmas Trees. Please come in and look around.

SOS SOUP KITCHEN

Our Lord's SoS team took a well deserved month off and did not serve in December. I'm collecting the total served for the year and will share with you soon. Needless to say, you did amazing things for the community through this mission. We are scheduled to serve **Jan 12th** at St John's. All the items needed are identified on the sign up sheets in the Narthex. We will be assembling them on Jan 11 and serving on Jan 12. We will plan on serving approximately 150 patrons. Preparations begin at 4:00 on Wed in the church kitchen. On Thursday we will assemble and cook the casseroles beginning around 3:30 and serve at 5:30. Please sign up on the sheets in the Narthex as you are able to support the mission. The expenses of the holiday season have likely taxed all our budgets and this may produce an additional need for our patrons. This makes the Jan meal very important and greatly appreciated to off set the holiday impact. As always, THANK YOU to the entire OLLC family as you provide food, volunteer time, and pray for the Spirit of Sharing meal. God's blessings to all as the new year begins.

FINANCIAL NEWS

In the month of November, the total income received by OLLC was \$30,640. The total expenses for the month of November were \$27,117. The Year-To-Date figures as of November 30, 2022 are a total income of \$343,031 and total expenses of \$387,685.

Zooming in on giving for VIF/BOOM shows that in November \$2,715 was given. Based on the prior month's giving, \$3,224 was paid on the mortgage. \$3190 went toward the principle and \$34 toward interest owed. Year-to-date at the end of November, we have paid \$35,846 on the principle and \$1,119 in interest. A year-to-date total of \$39,380 has been given toward VIF/BOOM. \$36,964 was paid out by November 30.

The remaining mortgage balance was \$4377 at the end of November. As of **December 19, 2022**, the OLLC mortgage is **FULLY PAID OFF!**Thank you to everyone who has contributed to this campaign and for your faithful giving throughout the past few years.


