Restoring Our Lord's House

Look what we have accomplished in a year! Restore Our Lord's House has reached completion (replacement of the AC units and cleaning/sealing of the sanctuary ceiling will be completed at a later time).

The remodeling project began in January 2021 with the removal of the kitchen cabinetry and relocation of all furniture from the narthex, commons, nursery, conference room, Fair Trade Shop, sanctuary and youth room to the fellowship hall. Painting of all spaces occurred late January through February. Flooring in identified spaces was removed and followed with installation of carpet and vinyl, a 3-week process occurring in March. April through May saw the installation of the kitchen cabinets with countertop installation following in June. A defect in the vinyl flooring was found and completion of the flooring was delayed until a new product was received. In late May the defective flooring was removed with new flooring installed. Furniture for the narthex and commons was ordered at the end of July (production and delivery was delayed by several months due to the pandemic). As spaces were completed furniture was removed from the Fellowship Hall and in August the process of remodeling the Fellowship Hall began. The space was cleared, walls painted, old carpet removed, and new carpet tiles installed (thank you Worker Bees for the work on the Fellowship Hall!) -- work completed October/November. In addition to the work completed by CertaPro Painters, Vallow Flooring, Absolute Construction, Buchanan Arts Family, and J & W Plumbing, more than 600 volunteer hours contributed to the completion of Restore Our Lord's House. Wow! It is amazing to see what can be accomplished when we work together.

As with all construction projects there is a punch list of jobs to complete; but the list is very short! The wood tabletops for the commons have been received and will be installed once the new table bases arrive. We received word that the two gliders for the narthex are currently in the finish shop; the remaining oak furniture for the narthex and the commons is still in production. Once all items have been completed shipment will be arranged. The upholstered seating for the narthex is expected in March. Your patience throughout the remodeling process has been greatly appreciated!

The capital campaign for the remodel began at the end of 2020; funds raised exceeded **\$109,500.** The remodel was projected to cost **\$116,500** (excluding sanctuary ceiling & AC units). Additional unplanned projects were undertaken during the remodel yet the project still came in under budget and well within the dollar amount raised! Look for a final report on the remodel in the Annual Report.

Thank you for your prayers, your financial support, your time and your patience during the remodel. OLLC can now move toward a future with a renewed focus on community, ministry and sharing God's love.

"The kingdom of God: What does it mean for God to be in charge?"

by the Rev. Mark Allan Powell

New Testament scholar Mark Allan Powell looks at a widely used biblical image and invites us into a discussion of what it might mean for Lutheran women today. The phrase "kingdom of God" and similar expressions turn up repeatedly in sayings of Jesus, so understanding what that expression means helps us to make sense of numerous parables and popular Bible passages (including the Lord's Prayer). Powell is author of the world's best-selling New Testament textbook and editor of the Harper-Collins Bible Dictionary.

January: Beautiful feet: Announcing the reign of God – The prophet Isaiah said, "How beautiful on the mountains are the feet of one who announces, "Your God reigns!" No one has ever fit the description better than Jesus, who talked more about the reign of God than he did about anything else. We will ask, what would it mean for God to be in charge of our lives? 
