PASTOR'S PAGE

While my relatives in Minnesota are experiencing a blizzard, we here in the Metro-StL area have springtime weather. Our external environment fits the season of the church year we have just begun. Lent is a time of spring cleaning (or spring training) for the soul. It is a time when we think and act in ways that refresh and strengthen our faith.

Lent started on Ash Wednesday with a reminder of our own mortality. With a cross of ashes upon our foreheads, we started the journey in which we will spend six weeks tracing Jesus' path to the cross. Each week we will hear stories that are a part of lesus' life – stories from the Older Testament that shaped him and his mission, as well as stories from his own earthly life. This is the year of lengthy, interesting stories. As you hear them, try to find your place in the story.

We make this yearly return to the cross and tomb so that our lives may be reshaped to conform more closely to the life of Jesus. That's why we tell the story again. That's why we sing the songs we have inherited from the faith community – songs of Jesus and his love. As we revisit these stories, we also add new ways of telling the story. We sing a new song. We dramatize the action so we can grab hold of what it means for us now. We entwine ourselves in the threads of the shroud of lesus and then reweave Jesus' story into our lives so that we stay attached to our Lord and Savior.

Inside this newsletter you will find references to the stories that will be shared at mid-week evening prayer services during Lent and on the weekends. Those being used at the 6:30 pm Wednesday services this year are ideally suited for children, which means we adults will love them too. If you have not been on-site for worship since the pandemic began, this is the perfect season for returning to our building. Lent is a season of returning, reweaving, and renewing. Come. Together, we can be a Christ shaped place of belonging.

MARCH COUNCIL BRIEFS

We all know and appreciate how important our families are. Family is there for you when you are really in need, they laugh with you and cry with you, and stand with you through the good times and the bad. Family members are linked together with a strong and common bond. That bond is not always genetic. There is a spiritual bond among fellow believers, and together we make up a spiritual family.

During the Annual Meeting in January I spoke of the family of Our Lords and the need to nurture and rebuild our church relationships. We all need a spiritual family - a community of people who genuinely love and care for us. The connections gained from our spiritual family has been lessened, and in some instances broken, since the pandemic. What actions must be taken to restore the spiritual bond between members of OLLC? How can we rebuild our church family? As winter ends and spring begins, it is time to imagine new possibilities and focus attention on reestablishing relationships within the congregation and strengthening the family of Our Lord's.

The February Council meeting opened with thanks to Dana Callahan for serving on Council and a warm welcome to Emily Truckenbrod for coming on board as vice president. Plans for a Mortgage Burning Celebration and a Facilities Cleaning Event were mentioned (information will follow in the months ahead). Plumbing repairs in the Life Center, the results of the Congregational Survey, and a timeline to review OLLC Bylaws and Constitution were discussed. As part of the council's commitment to monitoring all expenses and decrease costs whenever possible, a change in the carrier for insurance coverage was identified. Effective April 1, Erie Insurance will become the new insurance carrier for church property. Coverages will remain the same; however, total annual premiums will be reduced by over \$4000.

We have all received so much from God. May we look forward to all of the ways that God will lead us as we continue our venture in faith and focus on the spiritual family of OLLC.

The book of Exodus tells the story of God's deliverance of God's people from slavery, God's covenant with God's people, and God's abiding presence with the people of God. It is, outside of the revelation of God in Jesus the Christ, the most important revelation of God's character and is fundamental for understanding the rest of the Bible. No textbook is required.
