# PASTOR'S COLUMN

And the angel said unto them, Fear not: for, behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people. Luke 2:10

When are those times when you cannot help but share a story? There are moments in our lives where we have to share what has happened or what could happen, moments we cannot contain ourselves. We need others to know; we need others to share our laments and our joys. We spread the word.

Each year as we enter Advent we are encouraged to both listen to and share "tidings of comfort and joy." In the year of Mark, we hear from a gospel that was meant to be shared in one sitting. Mark is the storytelling gospel, short and easy to hear. In our Advent and Christmas season (year B of the Revised Common Lectionary) we may only read from Mark twice, but the urgency is felt in the two readings: hear the story! Enter the story! Share the story!

We are drawn-in further as John's gospel speaks of the beginning and the WORD. Then we find ourselves listening to messengers from God, who bring us tidings of great joy, first through the love of Mary who tells us of the one who turns the world upside-down, and then to the shepherds who bear witness and tell the story to all who will listen of a babe in a manger in Bethlehem.

From stories that are cosmic to stories that give us glimpses of a faithful family, these tidings we are called to share become part of our story. Our voices join the voices of the season to bring tidings of hope, peace, joy, and love to a world in need of such a resounding story.

# SATURDAY & SUNDAY HOSPITALITY HOSTS NEEDED

There is just something about chatting and fellowshipping over food, whether it is snacks or a light meal. Face it: food brings people together.

Additional hosts are needed for Saturday nights following the 5 pm service and Sunday mornings following the 9 am service. If you don't think you are qualified for hospitality because you are young, single, working, etc., you may want to team up and host with another member.

Saturday nights are usually light suppers serving between 15-20 people. Sunday mornings consist of breakfast pastries, fruit, & cookies serving between 10-20 people.

What are the responsibilities of Hospitality Hosts?

- prepare coffee/cold drinks
- set out paper products (plates, napkins, plastic ware) on the food credenza
- clean up consists of cleaning coffee pots and airpots and return airpots to their location on coffee bar in Fellowship Hall.
- wash, dry, and return all items to proper location in kitchen/Fellowship Hall (Do Not Leave any Dishes/Utensils air drying on counter or in the sink)
- remove all trash in the Commons Area. Bags should be tied up and carried to dumpster located between shed and Elmwood Care Center or placed in large yellow container in Kitchen Area. Replace with new trash can liner (kept in the right cabinet in Credenza)
- wipe down all tables, food credenza, coffee/drink area, kitchen counters, stoves, etc. Spot clean chairs if needed.
- sweep floor if needed and spot clean chairs of spills
- dispose of all leftovers. Do Not place leftover food in refrigerator.

There are three ways to access the online directory:

- • Go to members.InstantChurchDirectory.com and follow the prompts under "Sign In" to "Create a login now."

Whichever way you choose to access the directory, you will need to use the email address as listed in our directory (the email currently on file with the office).

- 1. Click on the Create Login button under: First time signing in?
- 2. Enter the email address as it is listed in the family portion of the directory.
- 3. Create a password. The password must be 8 characters long and contain at least two of the following special characters: capital letters, numbers or symbols.
- 4. Retype the password to confirm it and click Request Login.
- 5. Check your inbox for an email from service@instantchurchdirectory.com
- 6. To complete the sign-up process, you will need to verify your email address by clicking on the link sent to you in that email.
- 7. Once you confirm your email, you may sign at members.InstantChurchDirectory.com.

# **OLLC PRIVACY POLICY**

#### Privacy Policy for Gathering of Personal Information & Inclusion In the Membership Directory

Adopted October, 2023

Our Lord's Lutheran Church ("Our Lord's"), recognizes that an individual's privacy is very important to them and that they have a right to control their personal information. Our Lord's acknowledges that when an individual provides personal information about themselves to another party it is an act of trust. In response, Our Lord's takes the process of upholding an individual's privacy very seriously. Unless an individual gives Our Lord's explicit consent to act otherwise, the following policy will govern how Our Lord's handles an individual's personal information and safeguards their privacy.

• Collection of Personal Information

Any information that you provide to Our Lord's is used exclusively for church purposes. Personal information such as names, addresses, phone numbers, email addresses, birthdays and anniversary dates is shared through various print material and within the membership directory. This information is collected directly from members of Our Lord's Lutheran Church who have voluntarily provided this information.

• Use of Personal Information

The personal information collected in the membership directory is used solely for the purpose of communicating with members of Our Lord's Lutheran Church and facilitating member connections. This includes sending newsletters, event invitations and other important updates related to Our Lord's Lutheran Church.

• Protection of Personal Information

Our Lord's Lutheran Church takes the protection of personal information very seriously. All personal information collected is stored on secure servers, and access to this information is limited to authorized individuals who require access to perform their duties. Additionally, all access to the online membership directory is controlled by the directory administrators.

• Access to Personal Information

Members of Our Lord's Lutheran Church may access their own personal information in the membership directory through a mobile app or members' website that they create a unique login for. Only authorized members who are vetted by the directory administrator(s) will be granted access to the directory.

• Sharing of Personal Information

Our Lord's Lutheran Church will not share any personal information with any third parties without the explicit consent of the individual member. Our Lord's will not disclose your name, address, e-mail address or phone number without your express consent, unless disclosure is necessary to comply with laws or relevant legal proceedings. OLLC will not sell, rent or lease your personal information to commercial entities.

• Retention of Personal Information

Personal information collected in the membership directory will be retained for as long as the individual remains a member of Our Lord's Lutheran Church, and for a reasonable period thereafter.

• Changes to Privacy Policy

Our Lord's Lutheran Church reserves the right to modify this Privacy Policy at any time without prior notice. Members will be notified of any changes made to the policy via email or other appropriate means.




