PASTOR'S COLUMN





Some of you may remember that this is the congregation Kate Henderson attended while at the University of Illinois, Champaign. She served on the Church Council during a period of significant transition. Wonderful things are happening at St Andrews as a new building is taking shape. HERE COMES THE SUN! SOLAR ENERGY PROJECT CAMPAIGN -- JUNE, JULY, & AUGUST

The campaign to raise funds for the OLLC Solar Energy Project is underway! \$1550 has been received. There is still work to do if we are to meet our goal of \$40,000. Prayerfully consider increasing your giving to help fund the solar project (capital campaign funds are in addition to your regular giving). Visit the "Here Comes the Sun" display in the narthex; pick up donation envelopes, information cards, and a bottle of sunshine (Sunny D).

One-time contributions or monthly contributions are possible. Consider contributing the cost for one, two, three or more solar panels (approximate cost \$1500 per panel). If the cost of an entire panel does not work for you, contribute whatever dollars you can afford toward the solar project. If you are a part of an OLLC ministry group such as Morning Glories, Worker Bees, Adult Bible Study, Church Council, etc. consider pooling your funds to 'purchase' a panel, then challenge other OLLC ministries to match your group's giving. Every dollar raised gets us closer to reaching our goal!



The company leading the installation of solar energy for OLLC has been identified. Day & Night Solar will be coordinating the project for Our Lord's. The cost for the solar energy project was bid at \$120,154; the Federal Tax Incentive and Illinois Energy Renewable Credits anticipated total \$80,387.

All funds received through "Here Comes the Sun" exceeding the solar project costs will be used toward funding all/part of the compensation needed for a Coordinator of Young Adult, Family, & Member Ministries position; resealing the WC parking lot; and resealing the LC front parking lot. alcom a

SOS COORDINATOR NEEDED

The position will require the coordinator to:

 announce the serving schedule to the church membership (monthly requirement 15-20 minutes)
solicit volunteers for meal preparation and serving (monthly - sign up sheet is placed in the Narthex and if there are not enough volunteers you need to call possible congregational members and SoS coalition volunteers) - required time varies could be up to 2-3 hours
set the menu (monthly or bi-monthly done at Coalition meeting)



4) obtain the supplies needed for the meal (normally shopping can be completed at Gordon Food Service and Sam's Club - required time normally runs 3 hours)

5) lead the preparation and serving of the meal (monthly - normally arrive early to bring in supplies and prepare the kitchen for the volunteers - then stay until completion of serving - required time between 4-6 hours).

OLLC normally serves on the second Tuesday or the second Thursday. While not every month, we do serve 8-10 times a year. There is a Coalition Member meeting every two months, which takes about an hour in the evening if you join by Zoom or 1 hour and drive time if you are physically in the meeting room. For the interim Gail will take the meetings as the new coordinator(s) get their bearings working the serving effort. The SoS mission needs your prayerful consideration to meet this vacancy in our mission outreach efforts. Please feel free to contact Gail Jorgenson if you have questions regarding this request.

CENTRAL/SOUTHERN ILLINOIS SYNOD NEWS AND EVENTS

"LIKE GOOD STEWARDS OF THE MANIFOLD GRACE OF GOD, SERVE ONE ANOTHER WITH WHATEVER GIFT EACH OF YOU HAS RECEIVED" 1 PETER 4:10.

The 2024 Central/Southern Illinois Synod Assembly was held June 6-8 at Decatur Conference Center and Hotel with 277 people in attendance, including 145 lay voting members, 86 rostered ministers, and 46 visitors.

Bishop Greg Busboom presided over his first Synod Assembly with the theme of "Many Gifts, One Mission," based on 1 Peter 4:10, highlighting that we each have different gifts that we bring together to carry out the one mission of the church.

This year's Assembly featured a large slate of elections for open positions at both the synod and churchwide levels.

- Synod Vice President: Ms. Molly Berry
- Synod Council Members: Mr. David Poland and Ms. Cassie Roach
- Male rostered ministers nominated to the 2025 ELCA Churchwide Assembly for election to the ELCA Church Council: the Revs. Ryan Anderson and Adam Dichsen
- Voting members to the 2025 ELCA Churchwide Assembly: Mr. Scott Dietrich, Mr. Christopher Edmonds, the Rev. Jon Fry, Ms. Bella Karunas, Ms. Sundae Johnson, the Rev. Julia Rademacher, and Ms. Ana Viera. They will join Bishop Busboom and Ms. Molly Berry, who serve ex officio.

Voting members approved the synod's 2025 budget of \$1,230,000. Of that, \$578,100 (47%) will be directed to the ELCA for ministry at the churchwide level, with \$651,900 (53%) to be used by the synod.

The Assembly received the results of our synod-wide visioning surveys and istening sessions, which identify values, mission, vision, and emerging priorities. "Spirit Labs" breakout sessions were use to continue drilling down and identifying specifics that will shape our future as a synod.

COUNCIL BRIEFS

The threat of summer craziness has become a reality. I expected life at Our Lord's to slow down; that was not the case during June and July may be even busier. The summer began with VBS and graduation celebrations, we kicked off "Here Comes the Sun" to raise funds for the solar energy project, and identified the company that will lead the solar installation---all of this in the month of June. July is shaping up to be busy as well. There is a buzz going on in the church about the start of a young adult ministry and a ministry for young families; the Identity and Action Team will begin the review of the OLLC Mission, Vision, and Values; two OLLC youth plus Pastor will be attending the ELCA Youth Gathering in New Orleans; and Olivia, Cady, & Brian will share their musical talents during a "Concert in the Pines."

As I create the calendar of July events for the newsletter I felt a twinge of stress and anxiety. Isn't summer supposed to be stress-free and with fewer responsibilities? How do I find the time to do everything that needs to be done?

I recently came across a devotion from *Proverbs 31 Ministries* that suggested ways to navigate a stressful summer. To get through the chaos and stress of summer the article states, remember to focus on God's sweet goodness, instead of all the scribbles on the calendar. Focus on all the good things God has done for us so far this year, instead of the challenges of the summer months. Remain calm and pray for God's peace when the demands of family and life seem overwhelming. Ask God to give us rest and strength when we begin to feel stretched thin and worn out. Take time to unplug completely - meaning no phone or emails. Do something for yourself once a week.

- Madagascar Synod \$300.00


The funds for the Madagascar Synod were distributed via a check taken to the C/SIS Synod Gathering in June.


