HERE COMES THE SUN! SOLAR ENERGY PROJECT CAMPAIGN -- JUNE, JULY, & AUGUST

During the congregational meeting on April 20 & 21, with 65 members present, the vote to engage in solar energy for OLLC was passed-- 47 yes, 9 no, 3 abstain, 6 did not cast a vote. The next step in the project involves comparing the proposals from Day & Night Solar and Straight Up Solar. Following careful review of the proposals an installer will be selected and a thorough review of the contract will follow before signing a contract. The church will then enter a personal loan agreement with a church member for the entire project cost. Tax credits and Recoverable Energy Credits are anticipated to cover nearly 70% of the solar project. The personal loan will be repaid as tax credit are received. In effort to raise the anticipated \$35,000 **not covered** by the tax credits, a three month capital campaign will be held during June, July, & August.



Prayerfully consider **increasing your giving** to help fund the solar project (*capital campaign funds are in addition to your regular giving*). Any amount you give to "Here Comes the Sun!" will help us reach our goal.

Consider contributing the cost for 1 or more solar panels (approximate cost \$1500 per panel)

A one time gift may be given or your may give each month during the campaign.

All funds received through the capital campaign that exceed funding of the solar project will be used toward *funding all/part of compensation for Member Ministry/Young Adult & Family Ministry Coordinator position, resealing WC parking lot, and resealing LC front parking lot.*

Fairness to farmers. A closer connection between people and the farmers we all rely on. This was the essence of the vision that the three Equal Exchange founders — Jonathan Rosenthal, Michael Rozyne and Rink Dickinson — held in their minds and hearts as they stood together on a metaphorical cliff back in 1986. The three, who had met each other as managers at a New England food co-op, were part of a movement to transform the relationship between the public and food producers. At the time, however, these efforts didn't extend to farmers outside of the U.S.





The founders decided to meet once a week — and did so for three years — to discuss how best to change the way food is grown, bought, and sold around the world. At the end of this time they had a plan for a new organization called Equal Exchange that would be: *A social change organization that would help farmers and their families gain more control over their economic futures. *A group that would educate consumers about trade issues affecting farmers. *A provider of high-quality foods that would nourish the body and the soul.

*A provider of high-quality foods that would nourish the body and the soul.
*A company that would be controlled by the people who did the actual work.
*A community of dedicated individuals who believed that honesty, respect, and mutual benefit are integral to any worthwhile endeavor.

Dear members of our Central/Southern Illinois Synod,

"There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is above all and through all and in all" (Ephesians 4:4-6).

THANK YOU to all who have participated in our synod's strategic listening and visioning process so far! We are so encouraged that 638 people completed the survey and more than 150 people participated in one of four listening sessions held across the synod. In addition, we are grateful for all those who participated through each of our six conference assemblies.

- The responses reflect the vast and diverse geographic territory that our synod covers, and we are mindful of that geographic diversity as we work to determine a set of priorities and goals that will support our entire synod.
- The responses also reflect a yearning for an intentional focus on congregational health and well-being, including leadership development across the synod that meets the realities of our time and context.
- In addition, the responses show a deep yearning for a renewed emphasis on sharing the good news of Jesus with others through both our words and our actions.

Over the coming weeks, our strategic planning team will continue to discuss both the survey and listening session responses as we identify vision, mission, and values for our next chapter in ministry together as the Central/Southern Illinois Synod. Drafts of our work will be brought to the synod assembly in June as we continue to discern together. We continue to invite you to share conversation with us about this work. GET INVOLVED!

Deacon Jason Fisher, Director for Evangelical Mission, invites lay volunteers to join the ELCA Truth-Seeking and Truth-Telling work related to Indian Boarding Schools.

The ELCA is leading a coordinated effort to research Lutheran involvement in Indian boarding and day schools dating back to the 1820s. We are seeking both clergy and lay volunteers who want to be part of this initiative. All are welcome, with particular need for people with skills in research, data collection, organizing, and education. The goals are to find and gather information in order to share it with impacted Indigenous individuals, families and communities; for our church members to know our history of church-sponsored Indian boarding schools and their devastating impacts on Native communities; all as part of an ongoing truth and healing process.

We started in 2022 with 15 synods across four states. In May 2023, we expanded to 27 synods across 10 states (all of ELCA Regions 3, 5, and 6). We welcome you! Additional information and Interest Form can be found on the following webpage:
