### **OLIVE WOOD CARVINGS - NOVEMBER 16 - 17**



Shepherd Field Arts has been providing quality Holy Land olive wood carvings, including crosses, in the United States since 2008. It has been four years since Our Lord's hosted a display and sale of these items made by woodcarvers in and around Bethlehem. We are delighted to have Shepherd Field Arts return to OLLC before and after services on November 16 & 17.

This past year has been very difficult for our siblings in Christ who live in the Holy Land. During peacetime, many visitors to the Holy Land visit the Shepherds' Field and then stop at one of the wood carving shops nearby. Having just stood on the field where tradition says the angels visited the shepherds on the night of Jesus birth, it is natural for tourists to purchase nativity scenes. Other favorite Bible stories, such as Noah's Ark, as represented in wood carvings are also popular.





But because of the war in Gaza, tourism has dried up and the people in Bethlehem struggle to make a living. We can help them by purchasing some of the beautiful olive wood items their skilled carvers have created.

Bethlehem olive wood is heavy, dense and durable with distinctive colors that include nuances of red and creamy pigments with irregular gray, brown, and wild black lines. It is very difficult to match the grain of two pieces since the pattern is completely hidden in the heart of the wood. This makes each piece unique for gift giving or admiring in your home. As it ages, the wood will become darker and richer in color thus making it even more beautiful.
