OCTOBER GIVING EMPHASIS - OLLC SOS



It's fall and all the joy that comes with the season is unfolding. Back to school activities, football, bonfires, chili cook-offs, comfort food, and fall baking. The season is my favorite because so much of what I do involves people and food -- baking apple pies, cooking pumpkin everything, making soup and more soup, and slowing down to enjoy the company of family and friends. Thanksgiving and Christmas are on the horizon and it's more time spent with family and friends.

However, it is also a time when many in our community are focusing their energy on buying school supplies and new school clothes, school physicals, playing higher energy bills, and preparing grocery budgets that in the face of increasingly higher food cost. The average cost of ground beef is up almost 12% compared with Jan 2023, eggs are up 20% compared with summer 2023, and bread up almost 8% from 2023. These a just a few examples of the additional costs families nationwide are experiencing.

Our Collinsville community is not exempt to these increases and as a result the Spirit of Sharing Soup Kitchen has seen an increase in patrons. We had seen an increase over the last several years going from 10,309 in 2022 to 16,560 in 2023. This year our patrons have continued to grow and as of Aug 2024 we have served 13,403 and predict we could see as many as 20,104 by the end of 2024. OLLC averages approximately 190 patrons each month at an approximate cost of \$3.40 each. We have been very blessed this year with large donations of ground beef, lowering our average cost to approximately \$2.50 per meal.

The giving emphasis for the month of October will be support for the OLLC SOS Soup Kitchen. Throughout the month we plan to provide additional information on the mission, the costs, the opportunities for volunteers and donations. This mission supports our local community and spans all ages from infant to elder. In 2023, 13.5% of US households experienced food insecurity, that equates to approximately 18 million households. It is note worthy that that number represents households and not individuals. In 2023 Collinsville's poverty rate was 12.9%, suggesting we are close to the national average.

Perhaps it is impossible to know each of our patron's "situation" and perhaps impossible to eliminate food insecurity in the US completely, but why shouldn't we assume we can wipe out food insecurity in our community. We are God's hands, we are blessed with his unfailing love, and we have unlimited opportunities to serve our God and his people. The SoS Soup Kitchen is asking for your prayerful consideration during this focus period, to consider what is POSSIBLE with your support.

Funds given to SoS during October will go to the OLLC SoS designated fund. These funds are used to purchase groceries for the meals prepared and served by OLLC at SoS Soup Kitchen.

FIRST RESPONDERS BREAKFAST - ANOTHER GREAT SUCCESS

September 14 was the 2nd year Our Lord's Lutheran hosted the First Responder's Breakfast. A hearty breakfast was prepared and served to 75+ first responders from the area. Fire fighters, EMTs, police officers, dispatchers, emergency room workers, hospital workers and their families were invited. Several off-duty personnel shared the meal in the church building. For those not able to be with us due to work schedules, delivery service was offered. First responders from Collinsville, Edwardsville, Glen Carbon, Maryville, and Troy participated.





The breakfast may have been spearheaded by Our Lord's members, but the community was involved. Donations from Thrivent, Silly Grandma's Sweet Creations (Troy, IL), Bobby's Frozen Custard (Maryville, IL), Dunkin Donuts (Troy, IL), McDonald's (Alton, Bethalto, Edwardsville, Godfrey, & Hamel, IL), and A Sign Shoppe (Caseyville, IL) contributed to making the breakfast a community success.

SOS COORDINATOR NEEDED

Are you being called to be a part of SoS? Prayerfully consider leading or co-leading this ministry.

The position will require the coordinator(s) to:

- 1) announce the serving schedule to the church membership (monthly requirement 15-20 minutes)
- 2) solicit volunteers for meal preparation and serving (monthly sign up sheet is placed in the Narthex and if there are not enough volunteers you need to call possible congregational members and SoS coalition volunteers) - required time varies could be up to 2-3 hours
- 3) set the menu (monthly or bi-monthly done at Coalition meeting)
- 4) obtain the supplies needed for the meal (normally shopping can be completed at Gordon Food Service and Sam's Club required time normally runs 3 hours)
- 5) lead the preparation and serving of the meal (monthly normally arrive early to bring in supplies and prepare the kitchen for the volunteers - then stay until completion of serving - required time between 4-6 hours).

OLLC normally serves on the second Tuesday or the second Thursday. While not every month, we do serve 8-10 times a year. There is a Coalition Member meeting every two months, which takes about an hour in the evening if you join by Zoom or 1 hour and drive time if you are physically in the meeting room. For the interim Gail will take the meetings as the new coordinator(s) get their bearings working the serving effort.

The S.O.S. mission needs your prayerful consideration to meet this vacancy in our mission outreach efforts.



COUNCIL BRIEFS

During my teaching career I found it was important to LISTEN to what my students did not say as well as what they said. It was during the quiet times, during the silences that I learned the most about my students. The other day I came across the following message from a colleague:

A farmer lost his watch in the barn. The watch had great sentimental value, so he searched for it to no avail. He heard some kids playing outside, and explained to them about his watch, and asked if they would help him find it. They all searched but could not find the watch. The farmer thanked them for their help and sent them off. As they were leaving, one little boy asked if he could try again. The farmer decided to give him another chance, and the boy returned to the barn. About half an hour later, the boy walked out of the barn with the watch. The farmer was amazed, and asked how he could find it when so many had been looking and failed? The boy replied, "I didn't do anything...I just sat in the silence and listened. Eventually, I heard the ticking of the watch, and followed the sound." Sometimes, if you just sit quietly, we will hear the "ticking" of our Savior's promptings, leading us to the truth and helping us on our way.

It is often in the silence that we learn the most.

At the September council meeting \$700 of local benevolence was allocated (\$400 to CFiA and \$300 to SIUE Cougar Cupboard), we discussed giving trends for Current Benevolence and for Designated Giving (1/1/24 thru 8/31/24), council allocated \$500 toward the Life Center Landscaping Eagle Scout Project, discussed the September and November OLLC Concerts organized by Olivia Cross, and initiated development of a nominating committee and a contract review committee. Pastor shared the plans to financially support all OLLC youth grades 6-12 for the synod youth gathering in Carlinville in November. It is great to see an increase in the numbers of youth at Our Lord's and witness their involvement in church activities.

Look around, pay careful attention to the silence. LISTEN to what is being said as well as what is not said. Take time to stop, sit in silence, and hear what we are being called to do.


