

SOS COORDINATOR NEEDED


The position will require the coordinator to:

- 1) announce the serving schedule to the church membership (monthly requirement 15-20 minutes)
- 2) solicit volunteers for meal preparation and serving (monthly sign up sheet is placed in the Narthex and if there are not enough volunteers you need to call possible congregational members and SoS coalition volunteers) - required time varies could be up to 2-3 hours
- 3) set the menu (monthly or bi-monthly done at Coalition meeting)
- 4) obtain the supplies needed for the meal (normally shopping can be completed at Gordon Food Service and Sam's Club - required time normally runs 3 hours)
- 5) lead the preparation and serving of the meal (monthly normally arrive early to bring in supplies and prepare the kitchen for the volunteers - then stay until completion of serving - required time between 4-6 hours).

OLLC normally serves on the second Tuesday or the second Thursday. While not every month, we do serve 8-10 times a year. There is a Coalition Member meeting every two months, which takes about an hour in the evening if you join by Zoom or 1 hour and drive time if you are physically in the meeting room. For the interim Gail will take the meetings as the new coordinator(s) get their bearings working the serving effort.

The fall Adult Faith Formation class will be "Exploring the Lutheran Confessions," led by the Rev. Chris Repp (Grace, Champaign).

What we believe about God affects how we talk about God. How we talk about God determines whether we proclaim the gospel or some other message that is not faithful to who God is and what God is up to in Jesus Christ. This realization is what set Martin Luther and his colleagues down the path of reform 500 years ago. It is the enduring legacy of the Lutheran movement and a gift to the ecumenical church. This course is a study of the Lutheran Confessions to see how these texts continue to be vitally important to the mission of the church today.

Classes will be held from 9:00 a.m. to noon via Zoom on September 14 and 28, October 12 and 26, and November 16 and 30. Registration is open now at **CSIS-ELCA.org/aff24fall**. The cost is \$25 for a general course audit and \$50 for Synod-Authorized Ministry students. If cost is a hardship, please contact the synod office about a scholarship. COUNCIL BRIEFS

Ralph Waldo Emerson wrote.

Write it on your heart that every day is the best day in the year. He is rich who owns the day, and no one owns the day who allows it to be invaded with fret and anxiety. Finish every day and be done with it. You have done what you could. Some blunders and absurdities, no doubt crept in. Forget them as soon as you can, **tomorrow is a new day**; begin it well and serenely, with too high a spirit to be cumbered with your old nonsense. This new day is too dear, with its hopes and invitations, to waste a moment on the yesterdays.

Oftentimes it is easier to think of the past and reflect on memories but at Our Lord's, the church council and the ministry support team are doing their best to plan for **tomorrow** by discussing possibilities and implementing change. It is easy to think 'things use to be' or 'we always did it like this' but we must consider the needs of today and prepare for the future. What will church look like in 5 years? 10 year? 25 years? How to we make changes today for an unknown tomorrow?

At the August council meeting there was a focus on change:

- Plans for a Fall/Winter concert series were proposed.
- OLLC is going solar! The Solar Project is moving forward and the capital campaign is ending.
- We discussed OLLC members to consider serving as the Education Team Leader on the Ministry Support Team as well as individuals that may be willing to serve on a Nominating Team.
- In addition, we discussed staffing vacancies and changes to consider.

There was uncertainty and concern but also hopefulness leading to a brighter future.

Rarely do the plans we devise turn out exactly as we envision but In Jeremiah 29:11, God promises us that He holds the plans for our life.

For I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope.

Does that mean that life will be easy? That we will never face hardship or evil? No, because the brokenness of humanity, pain, and evil will always be part of our lives. Though we might not see or comprehend how God will use our cross for good, we know we can trust Him because He is a loving Father who always keeps His promises.
