PASTOR'S COLUMN

What about Good Works?

If you have been worshiping among Lutherans long enough, you may have noticed our order of service possesses three main sections: gathering, word, meal, and sending. There is more to the dismissal after receiving the benediction and singing joyful music than carrying the blessings of the gospel and the eucharist with us until we meet again next time. The Christian disciple is sent in mission into the world, that is, the communities to which we belong, to testify to the good news through action and to use words if necessary – the part related to doing more than speaking, allegedly belonging to Francis of Assisi. I digress, however. The important thing is that there's more to what we do between Sundays or Saturdays than the Christian of Lutheran perspective may give credit for.

If you are following from last month, Ephesians 2:8-9 flows into verse 10 in this way: "8 For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God—9 not the result of works, so that no one may boast. 10 For we are what he has made us, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand so that we may walk in them." Verses 8-9 send us to the 10th chapter of Romans, verses 9-10: "9 because if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. 10 For one believes with the heart, leading to righteousness, and one confesses with the mouth, leading to salvation." That you have it, faith alone in what God accomplishes through Christ redeems us and makes us righteous by grace.

Nonetheless, God's hope for us remains. Ephesians 2:10 takes us to 2 Corinthians, chapter 5, verses 17 to 21: "17 So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; look, new things have come into being! 18 All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and has given us the ministry of reconciliation; ¹⁹ that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting the message of reconciliation to us. ²⁰ So we are ambassadors for Christ, since God is making his appeal through us; we entreat you on behalf of Christ: be reconciled to God. ²¹ For our sake God made the one who knew no sin to be sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God." This means, beloved of God, that our loving Parent, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love, still hopes that our new self, recreated in Christ in the waters of baptism, will rise and become a witness to better things. However, the old self, full of the sin of Adam, always dies a hard death. That is why we gather again in worship, have our faith nourished and our sins forgiven by Word and Sacrament, and return to the world we live in to do it all over again. The journey will be different for each of us, but we can say that God still expects the arrow to somewhat point up.

DECEMBER GIVING EMPHASIS: OLLC PEOPLE IN A PICKLE



People in a Pickle is a ministry of Our Lord's which helps individuals, couples or families who find themselves in a proverbial pickle. Through the church Carol and Rod Orr and Carol and Dave Gocken provides assistance by meeting short term help with food, clothing, gas, stays at motels or anything else the person(s) need. This is funded through donations from church members who support the ministry through financial gifts. Those we assist are usually temporarily homeless. Though homeless, our brothers and sisters tend to be invisible to the public eye as they are not panhandling or in large groups you might see. So far in 2025 we have used approximately \$10,000 in this ministry.

The most recent person who we helped was a 25 year old woman who was pregnant and was squatting in an abandoned house. She had a young dog who had been abandoned and turned down our offer of a couple of nights at a motel. She said her primary need was warm clothing and food as she felt comfortable and safe in the abandoned house where she was squatting. In this instance, Carol Gocken took the young woman to Good Will in Granite City to pick out clothes she wanted and then to a grocery store to purchase food for she and her dog. It was determined she was receiving pre-natal care. The Orrs and Gockens have provided numerous services like this throughout 2025. This ministry would not be possible without your generosity.

PASTOR'S COLUMN (CONT'D)

This notion is recorded in the Lutheran Confessions. The Smalcald Articles: III, art. xiii, par. 1–3 state that ' "through faith" (as St. Peter says) we receive a different, new, clean heart and that, for the sake of Christ our mediator, God will and does regard us as completely righteous and holy ... Good works follow such faith, renewal, and forgiveness of sin ... [We] cannot boast about the great merit of our works, where they are viewed apart from grace and mercy. Rather, as it is written, "Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord" [1 Cor. 1:31; 2 Cor. 10:17]. That is, if one has a gracious God, then everything is good. Furthermore, we also say that if good works do not follow, then faith is false and not true.'

Our faith, siblings in Christ, transforms us and sends us towards our neighbor. In his preface to Romans, Luther wrote: "Faith is a living, daring confidence in God's grace, so sure and certain that the believer would stake his life on it a thousand times. This knowledge of and confidence in God's grace makes [a person] glad and bold and happy in dealing with God and with all creatures. And this is the work which the Holy Spirit performs in faith. Because of it, without compulsion, a person is ready and glad to do good to everyone, to serve everyone, to suffer everything, out of love and praise to God who has shown [them] this grace. 1" Furthermore, in the Freedom of a Christian, the reformer wrote: "[Believers] should be guided in all [their] works by this thought and contemplate this one thing alone, that [they] may serve and benefit others in all that [they do], considering nothing except the need and the advantage of [their] neighbor ... This is a truly Christian life. Here faith is truly active through love [Gal. 5:6], that is, it finds expression in works of the freest service, cheerfully and lovingly done, with which a [person] willingly serves another without hope of reward; and for [themselves, they are] satisfied with the fullness and wealth of [their] faith.2"

Are we there yet? I am certainly not. Therefore, I keep returning to the lavish grace poured over me, carried by the tune of the famous gospel song: "Here I am to worship; here I am to bow down; here I am to say that you are my God..."


MEET CHELSIE STEVENS - OLLC ADMINSTRATIVE ASSISTANT

Adult Faith Formation: New Testament

Learn about the history, theology, and significance of the books of the New Testament with the Rev. Dr. Mark Allen Powell. Classes will take place via Zoom from 9:00 a.m. to noon on Saturdays Jan. 24 and 31; Feb. 7, 21, and 28; and March 7. The cost is \$25 for general learners and \$50 for Synod-Authorized Ministry students.

This course will provide an overview of the New Testament as taught by the author of the world's best-selling textbook on that topic. The content of the course will be comparable to what graduate students learn when they engage the scriptures in a seminary classroom. We will profile the two most important figures of the New Testament — Jesus and the Apostle Paul — noting their enduring significance for the church and for the world at large. We will look at all four of the Gospels with an interest in the distinct contributions that each has to offer. We will also look at the sensational book of Acts and the mysterious book of Revelation, and we will examine a few representative epistles.

- \$179 was collected during the "Meet Katie Luther" presentation. Proceeds were sent to S.O.S.






