Erase Medical Debt

79 million Americans face the choice of paying medical bills or paying for basic needs like food and shelter. Our Lord's Lutheran can make a difference in many lives by raising funds in June to erase medical debt. We will be partnering with Undue Medical Debt, a 501c3 Non-profit that has a proven record. They identify people facing financial hardship and will use your gifts to purchase discounted medical debt at an average of \$1 for \$100 of debt.

This special giving emphasis was chosen based on a member of Our Lord's remembering a "5 on Your Side" news story about a Lutheran Church in Washington, Missouri relieving the medical debt of people struggling with overdue medical expenses. As your Giving Emphasis Team researched the possibility of doing something similar, we learned of other Lutheran congregations who have also worked with *Undue Medical Debt* (formerly RIP Medical Debt). One congregation in Maple Grove, Minnesota has challenged their congregation to give generously toward this for five consecutive years: *Lord of Life Lutheran Church | Erase Medical Debt* (Also, *Living Lutheran*, ran an article about this congregation in 2019: *A liberating hope - Living Lutheran*).

This month, you get to be a part of bringing joy and relief to individuals or families who then receive a letter telling them their medical debt has been paid off. Our goal as a congregation is to raise \$3,000 which will pay off \$300,000 in debt. Thank you for your generosity in this new (to us) endeavor.

COLLEGE CONNECTION TEAMS - SUPPORTING OLLC COLLEGE STUDENTS

Our Lord's is establishing College Connection Teams to foster support and encouragement for OLLC college students as they navigate their education. There will be nearly 25 students attending college next year. The plan is for five OLLC ministry groups to each 'adopt' five college students.

What is a College Connection Team: A dedicated team of church members that stay in touch with college students through emails, texts, or notes, offering encouragement and support.

How do you begin: Identify a group of people to be a part of your team. Notify the office of your team members. Your team will be assigned several OLLC college students.

What do you do throughout the year: Provide encouragement and support throughout the year such as send encouraging notes each month, sign and send holiday cards and birthday greetings, mail small care packages. Be creative, it is not necessary to spend large amounts of money. Simply offering words of encouragement, empathy, and prayer doesn't require any financial cost.

By implementing these strategies, Our Lord's will connect with the congregation's college students and provide them with support and encouragement to make a difference in their academic and personal lives.





COUNCIL BRIEFS

Let's just say that the month of May was a month of extremes. Erick & I hosted relatives from Sweden for several weeks. We spent most of our time traveling throughout the Midwest showing them the vastness of America. It was a joy to see the beauty of our country through the eyes of first-time visitors. Kenth and Angie were awed, overwhelmed, and inspired by the beauty and welcoming spirit of everyone they met. On the other hand, the month brought the sad news of Pastor's resignation and frustrations brought on by changes in the Administrative Office. Through the ups and downs of the month I found myself frequently praying, seeking Gods wisdom and guidance.

During the May council meeting the general business discussion was brief. Updates were given on the development of an Estate/Gift Policy, the review of OLLC website, OLLC branding and print material, as well as building and maintenance projects. The only action taken was to accept the bid for parking lot sealing from Aplin Concrete & Seal Coating. The project will be scheduled for later in the summer; when a date is known, the congregation will be notified. All funds for the project have been gathered, with a few dollars left over!

Although Pastor Darla Ann's resignation is met with sadness, there is good that can come from the change. Pastor has served us well. She has led us through a pandemic and we became stronger under her leadership. Yet, now is the time for her to lead another church and for OLLC to search for another pastor. I know that God has a plan and we must be patient and wait for the right candidate.

The Bible acknowledges that life involves challenges and difficulties, but these are not viewed as reasons for despair, but rather as opportunities for growth and perseverance. James 1:2-4 encourages believers to consider trials as pure joy, recognizing that they produce perseverance.
