PASTOR'S COLUMN

Just after daybreak, Jesus stood on the beach, but the disciples did not know that it was Jesus. John 21:4

Deep orange and purple Tulips filled the median between the incoming and outgoing traffic at the Botanical Garden. Inside the gardens there were even richer colors, as well as the basic yellow, white, pink, red, and purple. Some of the Tulips had so many layers of petals that, from a distance, I thought they were roses. When we planned our excursion, I had hoped that a few Iris plants would be blooming, even though it's a bit early for them. I had not given a thought to Tulips. But it was what I didn't expect that filled me with awe.

The word "surprise" doesn't appear very often in the Bible. (In the NRSVUE translation there are only 7 occurrences.) Yet over and over again, people whose stories are recorded in the biblical books are surprised. Events and beings that they didn't expect show up. Angels appear and tell them not to be afraid. Enemies appear and God rescues the people - sometimes guiding them through the waters and at other times walking with them in the fire. Throughout this season of Easter, Jesus will show up in unexpected ways in unexpected places. One story we will hear this month is when lesus surprises the disciples by showing up at the lakeshore and mixing them breakfast on the beach. It is one of my favorites and very fitting for Confirmation Day. lesus nourishes his disciples, asks a disciple if he loves lesus, and then commissions that disciple to feed and tend God's people. Confirmation day is a commissioning: vows are made after being nourished by the love and instruction of the congregation. As Kaitlyn makes her vows on May 4, I invite you to silently renew your own. After all, Jesus keeps showing up in unexpected places to feed you. Then he invites you to love him by being his hands and feet in the world. That is enough to fill anyone with awe!

Register your children, grandchildren, nieces, nephews, neighbors anyone you know who would love a week of fun, faith, and unforgettable memories!



COLLEGE CONNECTION TEAMS - SUPPORTING OLLC COLLEGE STUDENTS

Our Lord's is establishing College Connection Teams to foster support and encouragement for OLLC college students as they navigate their education. There will be nearly 25 students attending college next year. The plan is for five OLLC ministry groups to each 'adopt' five college students. Ministry groups such as Morning Glories, Boomers, OLLC Crafters, Bible Study, etc. are encouraged to 'adopt' students. Individuals or families can 'adopt' a student as well.

What is a College Connection Team: A dedicated team of church members that stay in touch with college students through emails, texts, or notes, offering encouragement and support. The team reaches out to the college student at holidays, provides encouraging notes, and may send small gifts and care packages. The intent if for the congregation

How do you begin: Identify a group of people to be a part of your team. Notify the office of your team members. Your team will be assigned several OLLC college students (names and contact information will be provided). Begin by introducing your self and your team to the college student via card or note.

What do you do throughout the year: Provide encouragement and support throughout the year such as send encouraging notes each month, sign and send holiday cards and birthday greetings, mail a small care package such as "Joy in a Jar" (a container of candy bars) for finals week, send homemade goodies during December, etc. Be creative, it is not necessary to spend large amounts of money. Simply offering words of encouragement, empathy, and prayer doesn't require any financial cost.

By implementing these strategies, Our Lord's will connect with the congregation's college students and provide them with support and encouragement to make a difference in their academic and personal lives.

SPRING FLING, SPRING CLEAN!

OLLC contracts a cleaning crew for routine cleaning of Worship Center and the Life Center (emptying trash, cleaning bathrooms, vacuuming, mopping as needed) however, deep cleaning is not included within the contract.

Sign up for your space and pick up a cleaning checklist from the church office. A sign up sheet is available in the Narthex. As you clean your self-identified space make a list of repairs needed and pass the repair information to Linda. In the months ahead, arrangements will be made to complete the repairs. Once you have completed your cleaning, please notify Linda so the space can be removed from the cleaning list. Spaces to be cleaned in the Worship Center include: Fellowship Hall, Kitchen, Men's Restroom & Women's Restroom, Nursery, Conference Room, Fair Trade, Commons, Narthex & Hallway, Sacristy, and Sanctuary. Life Center spaces include: Entry, Main Office Area, Box Room, Sunday School Room 1, Sunday School Room 2, Upstairs Restrooms (2 spaces), Conference Room, Upstairs Kitchen & hallway.

The 2025 Central/Southern Illinois Synod Assembly will be held June 5-7 at St. John's Lutheran Church, Bloomington. The theme for this year's assembly is "Carrying On in Christ's Mission" based on John 14:12: "The one who believes in me will also do the works that I do and, in fact, will do greater works than these, because I am going to the Father."

The festival worship service will be held at 7:30 PM on Thursday, June 5, and will be livestreamed at <u>YouTube.com/@csiselca</u>. All in the synod are invited to attend.



Ecumenical Celebration of the 1700th Anniversary of the Council of Nicaea – May 4 in Springfield

The Council of Nicaea in A.D. 325 gave us the Nicene Creed — a bold declaration of faith in Christ that continues to unite Christians around the world. In honor of its 1700th anniversary, the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception (524 East Lawrence Avenue, Springfield) will host an Ecumenical Celebration on Sunday, May 4, at 2:00 p.m.

This celebration echoes the spirit of the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, reminding us that unity is not a one-week event but a year-round journey. Inspired by John 11:17-27, we join to proclaim with Martha, "Yes, Lord, I believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God." All are welcome and invited to come together to pray, reflect, and renew our commitment to the unity Christ wills for the Church.

The council meeting began with the following devotion by P. Thorn, "The Monday After: Reflecting After Holy Week."

Monday is perhaps the most forgetful day of the week. We live much of our lives with this escapist drive toward the weekend, thinking the weekend will fulfill all of our needs and fantasies. More sleep! More time to work on those assignments! Time with God! Time with my good friends. Then Monday rolls around and our accomplishments seem meaningless and often forgotten.

As Christians, we have spent the past few weeks in anticipation of Easter. We prepared our hearts, We reflected on the cross and its significance. We felt the long, heavy pause between Good Friday and Easter Sunday – waiting for the discovery of an empty grave and a risen Savior. And then it comes. He comes. And then it's Monday. The temptation is to treat Easter like it's an ending. The eggs have all been found, Jesus is risen, we went to church,...and now it's back to "normal life."

But nothing was normal after Jesus. Easter was a revolution. It was the day after which nothing was the same ever again. When a man who claims to be God rises from the dead, "business as usual" isn't a thing. Easter isn't just a time to pause and reflect on some nice truths we tend to forget about the rest of the year. It is the entire crux of our faith. It is the only reason we have to hope.

We come into the Monday after Easter as a changed people. Not because we finally got to catch up on sleep. Not because we feel shiny and new and different. Not because of what we have accomplished. But because of what was done on our behalf.

Let us give Easter the place it deserves, not relegated to a day on the calendar but to a defining moment we celebrate over and over again with our choices and with our lives. How might God be giving you new hope and life?
