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PASTOR'S COLUMN

Made Righteous by God Through Faith

Grace to you, beloved of God, and peace from our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. One of my spiritual mentors once told me that if Christians of a Lutheran perspective were to explain what they believe to those of other faith traditions, reciting Ephesians 2:8-9 would suffice. Just as John 3:16 is called the gospel of Jesus Christ in a single verse, I like to think of Ephesians 2:8-9 as Lutheran theology in a single sentence. It says: **"For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God—not the result of works, so that no one may boast (NRSVue)."** Ephesians 2:8-9 is further elaborated in Romans 3:21-27, as we hear every Reformation Sunday. Still, it basically says that faith, or confidence (The Augsburg Confession 20:26), in the grace God lavished upon us when God came down in human form, died at the cross, and was resurrected to take away our sins, is a gift that we receive without merit. Hence, the passive voice. It is a gift that no one should boast about. It is a gift shared by all who have faith in Jesus Christ. The consequence of this gift is that we are saved, or made righteous, or justified through it. To be justified is to have our sins forgiven. That, my siblings, is the Doctrine of Justification—the article where the church stands or falls, according to the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther.

In times of political divisiveness, the Christian faith is being co-opted to support actions our Lord would not endorse. I find the Doctrine of Justification to be a balm to the conflicts that surround us. It curbs my judgment of others. It helps me to have at least some empathy towards those who strongly disagree with me and to forgive those who have trespassed against me. It also helps me to love my neighbor, regardless of who they are or what they believe. If my faith is not my doing but a gift, and the loving and gracious nature of God is reflected in all humanity (Genesis 1:27), then it is possible that God chose to be in relationship with those who do not share my faith in Jesus Christ. Justification, however, is no hall pass that excuses us from being diligent in doing good works for our neighbors. It is not enough for the Christian from a Lutheran perspective to say, "I believe, and therefore I am saved." Yes, faith has forgiven even our inaction, but the Christian believer was not created anew at the font for idleness. Our neighbors need our good works. More to come!

Safe drinking water means life not death for many in a place where one in five children die before their fifth birthday from water-borne or sanitation related diseases. The Shallow Well Program through Marion Medical Mission not only provides safe drinking water but also the necessary knowledge, skills, and tools to manage and maintain the protected water source, so that the supply of water continues in future years. Where shallow wells have been built, water-borne diseases are eliminated.

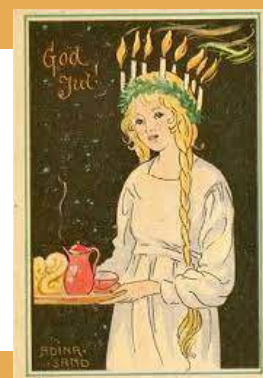

The sun rising over the horizon, filling the sky with shades of blue and orange, creating a stunning Illini Orange & Blue Sunrise.
