I will never cease to sing the praises of the Reverend Doctor Martin Luther, our Theological Father, ability to peel off the layers of our human condition when it comes to spiritual matters. Luther was himself a person who struggled mightily with his own sense of worthiness before God. He did not think of himself as deserving of God's redemption. He was often terrified of his perceived unrighteousness. Furthermore, his contentious nature and corrosive humor are well documented in the annals of the Protestant Reformation.

Therefore, I am fully aware that I may sound almost nonsensical by sharing how I have come to realize that the theology we inherit from Luther can be both instructive and comforting in the divisive times we live in America, particularly when it comes to issues of faith and society. I am also fully aware that many will not agree with this theology. We Lutherans can be pretty unique in some of the things we hold dear. I will, however, do my best to entertain your own curiosity by sharing some of these theological insights with you in the months to come. I also invite you to further conversations about them. This month, I would like to point out Luther's notion that at any time in our existence on this Earth, every believer, no exception, is simultaneously a sinner and a saint – in Latin, *Silmul Justus et Peccator*. Luther based this conclusion on two events that individual believers in any other time and place, had nothing to do with it but that have continuous influence in our spiritual lives. The first is that we all inherit the sin of Adam none are righteous- and the other is that every Christian believer is made a saint by faith in the death and resurrection of Christ, which is the Doctrine of Justification, but a subject for the next article, perhaps.

As I write this article, I must confess that I do not have the time to delve into Luther's writings on the matter. I have already blown two deadlines for this article. However, I suspect at least some of this theological Insight has to do with 1 John 1:8-9: "If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he who is faithful and just will forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness." Remember that old "confession and forgiveness" rite that you thought came from the mind of your pastor?

That, beloved child of God, becomes the great theological equalizer to all of us. Those two verses have the power to dismantle any pretense that we might have to be holier than anyone else under God. They take the weight of self-righteousness off our shoulders and effectively save us from being judged and from judging others, freeing us to practice love for our neighbor regardless of who they are. The cherry on the cake comes with the assurance that our Lord will forgive all and any of our transgressions upon the confession of such a condition. How liberating could that be?






#### **SOLAR PANEL UPDATE**

Many people have wondered about the savings resulting from the solar panels. It took a while to get the panels and recording instruments calibrated, but there is now sufficient data to provide a brief report on solar panel performance. Each graph shown below compares the electricity costs for the months of May through August for 2024 and 2025 for the Worship Center and the Life Center. For the four months shown, the difference in cost between 2024 and 2025 was almost \$2,500 for the Worship Center and about \$1,100 for the Life Center. Taken together, that is a reduction of about \$900/month.

While this analysis does not consider temperature differences between the two years and reduced use of the Life Center during the months we were without a pastor this summer, it gives a pretty good approximation of the savings. With regards to the energy credits and refunds, all paperwork for the SRECs and Federal Tax Refunds has been submitted and the requests are going through the approval process – we were told it can take a year or longer to receive the funds. Please be patient!

There is just something about being together and talking.....taking part in fellowship. Whether it is snacks or a light meal, food brings people together. Additional hosts are needed for Saturday nights following the 5 pm service (usually light suppers serving between 15-20 people) and Sunday mornings following the 9 am service (breakfast pastries, fruit, & cookies serving between 10-20 people).

What are the responsibilities of Hospitality Hosts?

- prepare coffee/cold drinks
- set out paper products (plates, napkins, plastic ware)
- clean up consists of cleaning coffee pots and airpots
- wash, dry, and return all items to proper location in kitchen/Fellowship Hall (do Not Leave any Dishes/Utensils air drying on counter or in the sink)
- remove all trash, bags should be tied and carried to the trash tote located south of the LC (by the side door) or placed in large yellow container in Kitchen Area. Replace with new trash can liner.
- wipe down all tables, counters, coffee/drink area, kitchen counters, stoves, etc. Spot clean chairs if needed.
- sweep/vacuum floor if needed
- dispose of all leftovers. Do Not place leftover food in refrigerator. Visit the table in the Narthex for Hospitality Hosts sign up sheet.

# "Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who need no repentance" (Luke 15:7).

Jesus knows his "why." Throughout the gospel and, particularly throughout Luke's telling of it, Jesus knows his purpose, his mission, his reason for being. Jesus is sent into the world to save. "Do not be afraid," announces the angel to the shepherds, "for see — I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord" (Luke 2:10-11).

Jesus' "why" is well-illustrated in Luke 15. In response to the grumbling of the religious leaders of his day, Jesus tells three stories. In story one, Jesus explains his "why" as being like a shepherd who leaves behind the 99 to go searching for the one lost sheep. In story two, Jesus' "why" takes the form of a woman who has 10 coins and will not rest until she finds the one coin she has lost. In story three, Jesus' "why" is embodied in the arms of a father welcoming home his wayward son. Jesus' "why" is clear. Jesus' "why" is to save those who are lost and he does not abandon his "why" all the way to the cross.

Unlike Jesus, it is all too easy for us to lose sight of the "why" to which we have been called through the water and word of baptism. Unlike Jesus, it is all too easy for us in the church to become so focused on keeping the 99 comfortable and preserving the nine coins that we still have that we entirely neglect the ones who are lost. Unlike Jesus, it is all too easy for us in the church to spend so much time and energy trying to keep the elder son happy that we miss the party we could be throwing for all those who are yearning to be welcomed home again.

Let me put it as clearly as I can. If our "why" is not Jesus, we are failing to be the church God calls us to be. If the "why" behind every single sermon we preach is not to lead the lost to Jesus, we are failing. If the "why" behind every single worship service we plan and choir anthem we rehearse is not to lead the lost to Jesus, we are failing. If the "why" behind every single youth activity we plan or church potluck we hold is not to lead the lost to Jesus, we are failing. If the "why" behind every dollar we share, every quilt we make, every can of food we collect is not to lead the lost to Jesus, we are failing. If the "why" behind every social statement we pass, every advocacy effort we undertake, every bold act of inclusion and hospitality we make is not to lead the lost to Jesus, we are failing. If our "why" is not Jesus, then church, what are we doing?



Several years ago, I visited the St. Marien Church in Wittenberg, Germany, where Martin Luther regularly preached. The altar painting inside St. Marien bears powerful witness to the essential "why" of our existence as Christ's church. Created by Lucas Cranach the Elder and completed by his son, Lucas Cranach the Younger, around 1547, the bottom panel of the painting depicts Martin Luther in a pulpit on the right. On the left is gathered Luther's congregation in Wittenberg. Directly in the center of the painting, between Luther on the right and the congregation on the left, stands the image of the crucified Christ. From the pulpit, Luther's arm is outstretched, intentionally pointing his hearers toward the crucified Christ.

In the image of the crucified Christ to which Luther points, we see the fullness of Jesus' "why." Jesus comes to save the lost, including us — all of us. We are the lost ones who Jesus saves. As those who have been saved, we are now the ones who Jesus calls and sends, by the power of the Holy Spirit, to lead other lost ones to him. Who are the lost ones today in your congregation, in your community, in the world around you? How are you pointing them to Jesus? And if you are not, what's your why?

#### **During August:**

- The balance of the Monthly Emphasis Fund at the end of August 2025 was \$329.17 (\$49.17 - School Supplies & \$280.00 to Amare).
- A check for \$2438.00 will be sent to CS/IS for Synod Benevolence during August. Local Benevolence for the Third Quarter (July & August) is \$456.
- The Employee Retention Credit received totaled \$37,394.88 less \$5,953 (accounting fees) =\$31,441.88.
   A check for \$2830 (approximately 9% of \$31,441.88) will be sent to CS/IS. Also, an additional \$314 will be available for Local Benevolence (1% of \$31,441.88).

#### **Employee Retention Credit received from 2021 & 2022**

A total of \$37,394.88 was received from the Employee Retention Credit. The ERC was a refundable tax credit for certain eligible businesses and tax-exempt organizations that had employees and were affected during the COVID-19 pandemic. From the amount received \$5,953 was paid to the church accountant for filing fees; \$2830 (approximately 9% for Synod Benevolence) to CS/IS, and an additional \$314 will be available for Local Benevolence (1% of \$31,441.88). Of the \$28,299 remaining balance, \$10,000 was transferred to Building & Grounds to pay for the resealing of the parking lots. The remaining \$18,260+ has not been allocated to any fund or project. Discussion on the best way to utilize these funds will occur at a later time.


