HOPE IN EVERY STITCH: SEW-A-THON TO SUPPORT GIRLS' HYGIENE

"For we are God's handiwork, created to do good works." Ephesians 2:10

The OLLC Crafters hosted a sew-a-thon on March 21 to make reusable feminine hygiene pads. Over 20 people attended, and together we completed over 150 pads, with an additional 200 pads in progress. These pads will be used to fill 60 hygiene kits for young girls in Zambia.

This initiative is crucial as many girls in sub-Saharan Africa miss school during their periods due to a lack of sanitary products, leading to increased dropout rates and higher pregnancy rates. Providing pads and education can improve school attendance by 17%, ensuring better educational outcomes and reducing dropout rates.

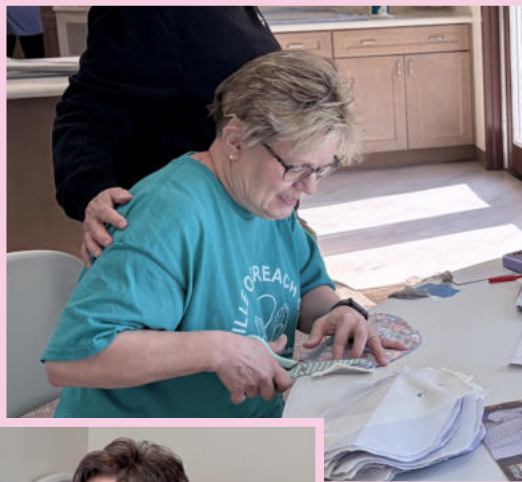
The sew-a-thon fostered community spirit, raised awareness about the challenges faced by young women in Zambia, and increased compassion and understanding for those in need. The OLLC Crafters will discuss the feasibility of hosting Hope in Every Stitch in the fall in addition to the March event.

To make each pad, we need to cut fabric, assemble pieces, trim/turn, iron, and attach snaps in addition to sewing.

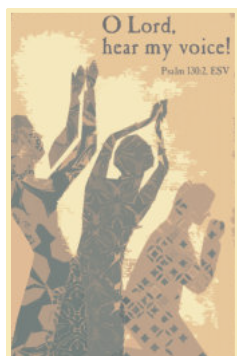

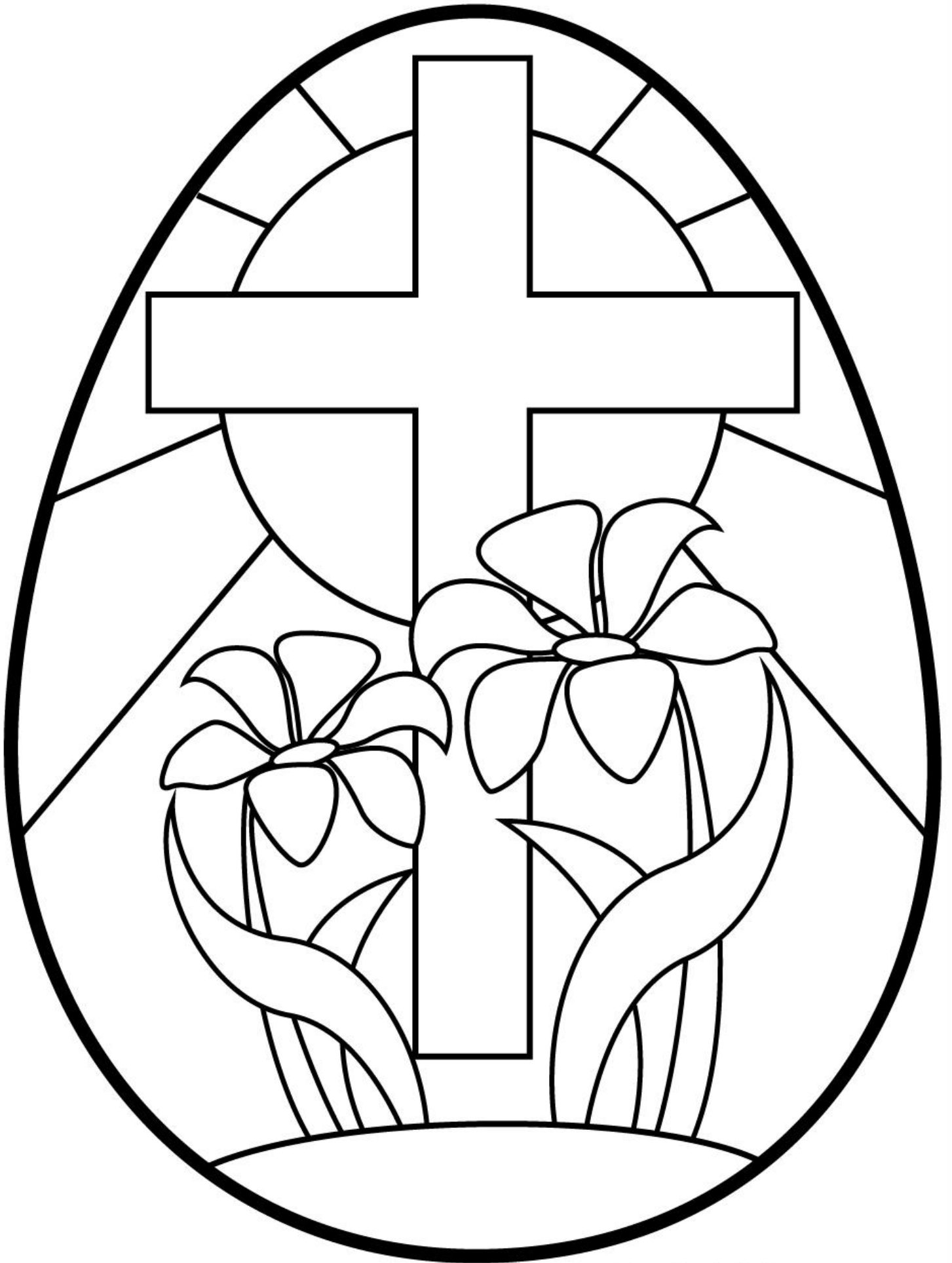

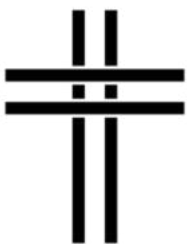
