PASTOR'S COLUMN

Greetings, friends at OLLC!

A few years ago I read a book recommended for church leaders entitled *How To Lead When You Don't Know Where You're Going: Leading in a Liminal Season*, by Susan Beaumont. I liked the assessment of reality and the assurance of this book, as none of us really knows exactly where we are going because of ever-changing conditions, but we can still lead and live out of our centeredness in God's faithfulness.

Liminality is living in between. It's a stage that you have been in for much of the past year. You are transitioning from the leadership of the former full-time called pastor to the leadership of a future called pastor. So certain functions and adjustments have needed to happen to move through this process and so far they seem to be on track. Thanks be to God for the leadership of your members!

But deeper than the structured details of the transition phase is what is being formed as the congregation has lived in the state of liminality. Some have labeled church liminality as a heightened experience of "already/not yet." That kind of language reminds us of Jesus' teaching of the Kingdom of God. The Kingdom is already here, yet continuing to be more fully revealed and experienced. Likewise, you are already the people of God and in my estimation, living into that identity and mandate quite effectively, yet you are traveling on to something new, with ever more significant ways to live into that on the horizon.


I fully believe that Our Lord's Lutheran Church has a bright future. I assure you that I pray daily that what God is doing to bring that into fruition for you will be revealed clearly, both in the pastor who will be called AND in the shape the congregation continues to take as people who understand your own calling as God's beloved children and community of faith.

Thank you for your prayers for me and for your cooperation as together we journey onward in this liminality as we keep "looking to Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of our faith" (Hebrews 12:2).

The Discovery and Invite (D & I) Committee has two scheduled meetings to complete the work by the end of March. In January, we reviewed the congregation's responses to the question "I expect a pastor to ____." We evaluated our own ministry characteristics: as a community, through leadership style, programming, and theology. Finally, we ranked the top ministry tasks that the congregation's responses highlighted.

Our February meeting was focused on the responses to "I will support the pastor by ____." We reviewed the gifts and talents or themes of the gifts and talents among the members of the congregation, as well as developed additional responses for more of the MSP form's question prompts.

LENTEN WORSHIP WITH HOLDEN EVENING PRAYER: WEDNESDAYS 6:30 PM

This five week series is intended to engage us with the challenging issues that are part of each of our lives at one stage or another. As Jesus encountered people dealing with all sorts of questions and life situations, we can see ourselves and realize that He understands and cares for us in any and all of our wonderings and situations. Meditation stations and the lighting of candles will provide ways for personal reflection and listening to God each week on the following topics:

- March 4 - Blessed Are The Curious, John 3:1-17**
- March 11 - Blessed Are Those Who Suffer, Romans 5:1-11 and John 4**
- March 18 - Blessing For When You Suffer Alone, Psalm 23 and John 9:1-41**
- March 25 - Blessed Are Those Who Mourn, John 11:1-45**

In all these situations, the circumstances can be difficult, yet the grace of God is to be found as God's presence and love surround us. Mid-week services usually last between 35-45 minutes. The music of Holden Evening Prayer that was written at a Lutheran Retreat Center by Marty Haugen creates a sense of peace and hope.




